Hello Highlanders!

I was caught off guard a bit this week when I realized that Thanksgiving is less than 2 weeks away. Preparations for our annual Thanksgiving meal are well underway but the fast approach of Thanksgiving also means that another HPC tradition is also fast approaching - our annual stewardship dedication day (which we have traditionally held on the Sunday before Thanksgiving).

This has been an amazing year for Highland in so many ways - we have seen God work powerfully in so many ways: the continued strength and growth of our children's programs; our vibrant and diverse worship experiences; the largest number of youth participating in ASP since 'pre-pandemic'; the continued excellence of our Highland Learning Center; and, of course, achieving our long-held goal of paying off our debt.

In some ways, after the year we have had, it might be tempting to 'rest on our laurels' - especially when it comes to our financial stewardship. But I don't believe - and our session, finance, and generosity committees don't believe that is good stewardship of the resources we have been entrusted with. After operating under the cloud of debt for so long, now is the time when we must refocus our efforts and faithfully steward our resources so that we can invest fully in God's call on our church to Share God's Love with each other, our community, and the world.

As we have highlighted many times, we would not have been able to achieve our goal of paying off our debt without the faithful work and giving of so many of you. And that faithful giving is just as important now as we move into the next phase of our life together serving God.

We have established three reserve funds (operating, maintenance, and Learning Center) so that we can continue to be fiscally responsible and operate in a sustainable fashion for the foreseeable future.

We have worked to strengthen our commitment to mission and service through our support of the Learning Center, the Family Life Center, Interfaith, the weekly food pantry, Thanksgiving meal, Power Forward, and more. We are moving forward in our commitment to grow our church in discipleship, mission, and outreach as we begin the process of calling an associate minister. We are continuing to prioritize our children and youth by our strong commitment to staffing and providing resources in those areas.

We continue to step out in faith, seeking to live into God's call and participate with him in his mission and ministry in our world. One of the powerful ways you can do that is through making a pledge to Highland for the 2024 year. A pledge allows us to plan more accurately to utilize all our resources in service to our mission and vision.
