Hello Highlanders,

As we come to the end of June and the middle of the summer (at least for those on a school schedule), chances are that your family schedule has been different over the last month (and for the next month or so) than it is the rest of the year. Summer comes with lots of wonderful things: vacations; day trips to the beach; extra weekends away; even just later than usual nights around the pool or outside with family and friends.

These are all wonderful things, but they often come with the trade-off of missing some of the good habits that are more easily a part of our lives the rest of the year. One of the most obvious of those is less regular attendance at church.

I have been thinking about that this past week as I was not present for worship this past Sunday, as I was in Texas with Charlie for a regional soccer tournament. On Sunday morning, I was definitely missing our church family and the set aside time to worship God together and grow in my faith. Specifically, I was thinking about how we can not just maintain, but even continue to grow in our faith during times when our schedule means we aren't always present to worship together.

As I was thinking about that, I came across this quote from author James Clear: "On the ground, a rock is just a rock. But when moving at high speed through the atmosphere, a rock becomes a meteor—alive with fire and burning bright. People are not so different. Without activity, we are lifeless and dull. When moving fast and taking action, we come alive."

Just like the rock and people, our faith comes alive with movement and activity. And that activity isn't limited to being able to join us for worship or attend a Bible study. Both of those are good and important things, but every situation provides us with the opportunity to activate and exercise our faith in ways that help us grow and move us towards deeper faith and faithfulness.

This week, I thought about that as I sat on the sidelines of soccer games. I realized, not for the first time, that the way I cheer on and interact with the teams on the field - and the referees not only has an impact on how others see me (and, so, perhaps how they see Christians and even Jesus), but also on how my own faith develops.

Similarly, when we ended up having an 'extra' 24 hours added to our trip because of a flight cancellation, there were lots of opportunities to interact with people in a way that either bore witness to Christ, and helped me grow or not. Our days, wherever we are, and whenever it is, are filled with these opportunities to exercise our faith and faithfulness. They are opportunities to invite others to know the one whose love has changed us, and for Christ's love to continue to affect that change.

So, as you and your family move and participate in all the wonderful activities of summer, remember that in all of these times and places there are opportunities for your faith to be activated and to grow as well.
