Music Notes with Pam... When you enter the music office, on the left are a few of the hymnals I've acquired over the years. Some from churches I've served, some from courses/seminars, some gifts. The singing of hymns and psalms in worship pre-dates Christianity. It is something Jesus himself would have been familiar with in the temple, and he certainly sang at the Last Supper - "After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives" wrote Matthew.

Highland's 1990 Presbyterian Hymnal is a wonderful collection of 605 hymns and songs. Of course it contains the most popular titles: "Holy, Holy, Holy;" "How Great Thou Art;" and "O For a Thousand Tongues to Sing." It also contains many that we have never learned. While studying church music at Southeastern Seminary and Virginia Wesleyan, the importance of increasing your church's hymnody was a prevalent topic and it's a responsibility of the role of director of music that I gladly accept.
