Devotional

What comes into your mind when you think about God? According to A. W. Tozer, the answer to this question is of the utmost importance. What we think about God will be the engine that drives the rest of our decisions. As we think through the question we can see if what we think about God matches up with what we read about God in the Bible. In this season of advent, another way of approaching the question is to ask, do I really believe that God loves me? Do I really believe as it states in Zephaniah that God rejoices over me with gladness? Will God truly quiet me with his love?

On this Christmas Day, we celebrate one of God's great acts of love. In the birth of Jesus we see God's great love for us. Jesus, though in the form of God, emptied himself to become a servant and was born in the likeness of men (Philippians 2:6-7). Jesus is the mighty one who will save us from our sins and our bondage. Jesus' birth is marked by the same thing that will permeate the rest of his life and ministry, love. As we celebrate the birth of Jesus, may we let our lives be permeated by a God whose love rejoices over us with gladness; the same love that drives Jesus to come be in our midst.

Response
