James 1:22–27 (ESV)²But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. ²³For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. ²⁴For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. ²⁵But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing. ²⁶If anyone thinks he is religious and does not bridle his tongue but deceives his heart, this person's religion is worthless. ²⁷Religion that is pure and undefiled before God the Father is this: to visit orphans and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unstained from the world.

Matthew 7:24–27 (ESV)²⁴"Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock. ²⁵And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock. ²⁶And everyone who hears these words of mine and does not do them will be like a foolish man who built his house on the sand. ²⁷And the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat against that house, and it fell, and great was the fall of it."

Romans 15:1–7 (ESV)¹We who are strong have an <u>obligation</u> to bear with the failings of the weak, and not to please ourselves. ²Let each of us please his neighbor for his good, to build him up. ³For Christ did not please himself, but as it is written, "The reproaches of those who reproached you fell on me." ⁴For whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, that through endurance and through the encouragement of the Scriptures we might have hope. ⁵May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to live in such harmony with one another, in accord with Christ Jesus, ⁵that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁵Therefore welcome one another as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God.

strong person (abstractly) — a person characterized moral strength, courage, will, or other cognitive feature.

weak person (abstractly) — a person characterized by lacking moral strength, courage, will, or other cognitive feature. ¹

Obligation - ὀφείλω (opheilō). vb. **to owe, ought.** This word can refer to owing money or goods, or more broadly to being obligated. The verb opheilō is used in diverse ways. It can express obligation or duty. It can also mean more specifically "to owe"; the debt owed can be money or goods²

Romans 12:9–16 (ESV)⁹Let love be genuine. Abhor what is evil; hold fast to what is good. ¹⁰Love one another with brotherly affection. Outdo one another in showing honor. ¹¹Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord. ¹²Rejoice in hope, be patient in tribulation, be constant in prayer. ¹³Contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality. ¹⁴Bless those who persecute you;

bless and do not curse them. ¹⁵Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. ¹⁶Live in harmony with one another. Do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly. Never be wise in your own sight.

Romans 13:8 (ESV)⁸Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law.

Romans 14:1 (ESV)¹As for the one who is weak in faith, welcome him, but not to quarrel over opinions.

Romans 14:19 (ESV)¹⁹So then let us pursue what makes for peace and for mutual upbuilding.

What are some ways that we can encourage and build up one another?

Galatians 6:1–5 (ESV)¹Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted. ²Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ.

Colossians 3:23–24 (ESV)²³Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men, ²⁴knowing that from the Lord you will receive the inheritance as your reward. You are serving the Lord Christ.

2 Corinthians 9:6–9 (ESV)⁷Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. ⁸And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work.

2 Corinthians 13:11 (ESV)¹¹Finally, brothers, rejoice. Aim for restoration, comfort one another, agree with one another, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you.

Hebrews 12:3–4 (ESV)³Consider him who endured from sinners such hostility against himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted. ⁴In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood.

John 16:33 (ESV)³³I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world."
