- 1. What has God shown you as you study his word this week?
- 2. Is there something God is asking you to surrender and trust him with this season?
- 3. How might you approach prayer differently moving forward this week?
- 4. How will you personally apply what you learned from the sermon to your life?

**Pray:** Take time to pray that people will give glory to the one who Christmas is intended to celebrate.

**Read:** Luke 1:5-25, Hebrews 4:14-16, Hebrews 7:23-25, Isaiah 7:14, Luke 1:67-68, Matthew, 1:23, Matthew 11:2. Take time to reflect on these passages and write down your thoughts.

**Write:** Write down your thoughts and insights from the sermon this week. Keeping a journal is just one more tool that you can use to track what God is showing you in your walk with him.
