

## **BIG IDEA**

"The only guarantee in life is Jesus Christ. And though our eyes may see what only appears to be vanity and meaninglessness, just the passing of vapor in the wind, we fix our eyes on Jesus Christ - the One who said death no longer has the final word, for he defeated death on our behalf on the cross. The full life, the life of joy and hope and peace and love and purpose and life you long for, is found in Jesus Christ and in him alone. This is what the teacher wants you to know - this is what I hope you'll believe today. Jesus sees us in the pit of life and takes us by the hand, and lifts us out of the pit. Look to Jesus Christ and believe in him, for he is the only guarantee in this life and in the life to come."

- 3. Why should trusting in God's sovereignty bring us peace and joy in life?

- 6. What is the godless view of life? What do we often fill our lives with? How are we squandering what little time we have?
- 7. Why is there still hope for the living? Why must we be careful with what we think matters, especially in light of death?
- 8. How can remembering that God is the giver of all gifts help us enjoy them more?
- 9. Why is Jesus the only guarantee in life? What does he do for those who put their faith in him? Read Colossians 1:15-23; Romans 8:28.
