A MOVEABLE FEAST - the Date of Easter in 2022

Easter occurs each year on the first Sunday, after the first full Moon (16 April 2022 - the Paschal Full Moon, the day before Easter 2022), after the Vernal Equinox (Sunday, 20 March 2022)

The earliest possible date for Easter is March 22nd; the latest possible date for Easter is April 25th. This year Easter Sunday is 17 April 2022.

THE STRUCTURE OF LENT THIS YEAR

BEGINNING OF LENT 2022 - Ash Wednesday: 2 March 2022 - and the DARK OF THE MOON (NEW MOON)

First Sunday of Lent: 6 March 2022

The COVID Mask Requirment concludes: March 11th at midnight

Second Sunday of Lent: 13 March 2022 - Daylight Savings begins; anniversary of the Papacy of Pope Francis I (2013)

FULL MOON (the Worm Moon; the Sap/Sugar Moon): 18 March 2022 - It is the last Full Moon of the season of Winter, and so referred to also as the Lenten Moon

SOLEMNITY of St. Joseph, Husband of Mary

Third Sunday of Lent: 20 March 2022 - the VERNAL EQUINOX (first day of Spring) this day at 8:33 AM PDT

SOLEMNITY of the Annunciation to Mary: 25 March 2022

Fourth Sunday of Lent: 27 March 2022 - Publication (1667) of *Paradise Lost* by John Milton

ANNIVERSARY (c. 570 CE, March 30th) of a traditional date for the Birth of the Prophet Muhammad in Mecca - "According to tradition, in 610 he was visited by the angel Gabriel, who informed Muhammad that he was the messenger of God. His revelations and teachings, recorded in the Qur'ān, are the basis of Islam." [Britannica]

DARK OF THE MOON (NEW MOON): Friday, 1 April 2022

Fifth Sunday of Lent: 3 April 2022

ANNIVERSARY (6th to 4th centuries BCE - no certainty) of the traditional birthday of Gautama Siddhartha - the Buddha - **Buddha**, (Sanskrit: "Awakened One") clan name (Sanskrit) **Gautama** or (Pali) **Gotama**, personal name (Sanskrit) **Siddhartha** or (Pali) **Siddhartha**, (born c. 6th–4th century BCE, Lumbini, near Kapilavastu, Shakya republic, Kosala kingdom [now in Nepal]—died, Kusinara, Malla republic, Magadha kingdom [now Kasia, India]), the founder of Buddhism, one of the major religions and philosophical systems of southern and eastern Asia and of the world. *Buddha* is one of the many epithets of a teacher who lived in northern India sometime between the 6th and the 4th century before the Common Era. [*Britannica*]

Sixth Sunday of Lent: 10 April 2022 - also called Passion Sunday

ANNIVERSARY (1506) of the birth of St. Peter Faber, SJ, heavenly patron of The Faber Institute (founded on Saturday, 1 October 2014, on the feast day of St. Therese of Lisieux, OCD) and Board Member

CONCLUSION OF LENT 2022 at sundown on Holy Thursday, 14 April 2022.

THE SACRED TRIDUUM: "the holy Three Days": 14-17 April 2022

- **Day One (April 14-15)**: From sundown on Holy Thursday to sundown on Good Friday
- **Day Two (April 15-16)**: From sundown on Good Friday to sundown on Holy Saturday FULL MOON (the Paschal Moon), 16 April 2022
- Day Three (April 16-17): From sundown on Holy Saturday to sundown on Easter Sunday
