2 Peter 1 The Life and Letters of Peter

Opening discussion: Peter got to see some really cool things (like the Transfiguration). Talk about some really cool things you've seen in your life.

Highlights

- Mark 9:5-7 The Transfiguration. Not only did Peter see, but he heard God's voice.
 - Peter didn't know what to say but like Peter is, he had to say something!
 - God said to listen to Jesus, and Peter did!
- 2 Peter letter written to the same churches, he is still in Rome, he knows he's going to die soon.
 - This is the last letter before he dies, so we need to look at it from the perspective of "what does he want to say to them?"
- **2 Peter 1:1-2** Peter is saying, I have something for you that will help you grow spiritually to those who have said "yes" to Jesus. This letter is for us today too.
- 2 Peter 1:3-4 There are two natures: divine God's nature, corrupt the world; leads to death

 "Participate" God is inviting you to a partnership
 - Koinonia community. What does it look like to participate in divine nature?
 - God's promises
 - He promises to create community between him and us
 - We don't ask God "do you promise?" He just promises because He wants that partnership with us.
 - He doesn't owe us anything, he just wants us.
 - What are some of God's promises? Hint: Look throughout Scripture
- 2 Peter 1:5-7
 - Faith (our salvation) is our foundation; our roots
 - Growing our faith comes out of our fruit.
 - We typically have it backward. We often say, "I have to be good enough and the fruit of that is that my faith will grow."
 - Goodness moral excellence
 - Knowledge general intelligence, facts, understanding
 - Self-Control even though I want it I don't have to have it
 - Perseverance God has you on a path and you don't waver from it
 - Godliness You want to look and act like Jesus
 - Mutual Affection (Philadelphia) brotherly love. I love you and you love me.
 - Love (Agape) I love you deeply and expect nothing in return.
 - You can do all these things and not follow Jesus. When they are built on the foundation of your salvation, and stream out of that, it's different.
 - 2 Peter 1:8-9 When we had these things in increasing measure, it changes our life.
 - Ineffective barren, unproductive unfruitful
 - Nearsighted you can't see where God is taking you; Blind what's in front of you, you cannot see.
 - Forgetting sometimes we get so used to doing the "Christian things" we forget who we were before Jesus saves us.
 - Don't forget your salvation you are a new creation, changed by Jesus
 - You MUST grow.

- 2 Peter 1:10 never stumble
 - We need to grow in increasing measure in all of them; when we do, sin will be rooted out of our lives.
 - Take a look at the list. What are the things that because you're not growing in increasing measure tend to lead you toward sin.
 - Growing in increasing measure roots out sin.
- 2 Peter 1:12-14 I'm not going to be here much longer and I want to make sure you remember what I've told you. I will continue to make tell you to make sure you remember. If you knew you were going to die soon, what would you want to make sure everyone knew?
- 2 Peter 1:16-17 I didn't make all this up. I was there! What have you seen Jesus do that you can say, I was there! Hint: How is he changing your life? (You were certainly there for your own story!)
- **2 Peter 1:19** Still don't believe me? Let's turn to the OT and see what the prophets say.
- **2 Peter 1:21** Man didn't write that God did, through the Holy Spirit.

3 Takeaways

- God owes humanity nothing
- God desires community & partnership
 - He lives out His promises
- As we commit to community & partnership we grow.

- Where were you before Jesus?
- Why are you here now?

Jesus is who He says He is

Do you want to grow in increasing measure; He desires to partner with you, Do you desire the same?

Do not forget we must grow. We have to remember our salvation, but we cannot stop there.
