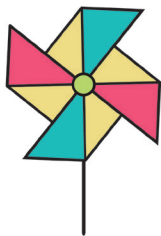

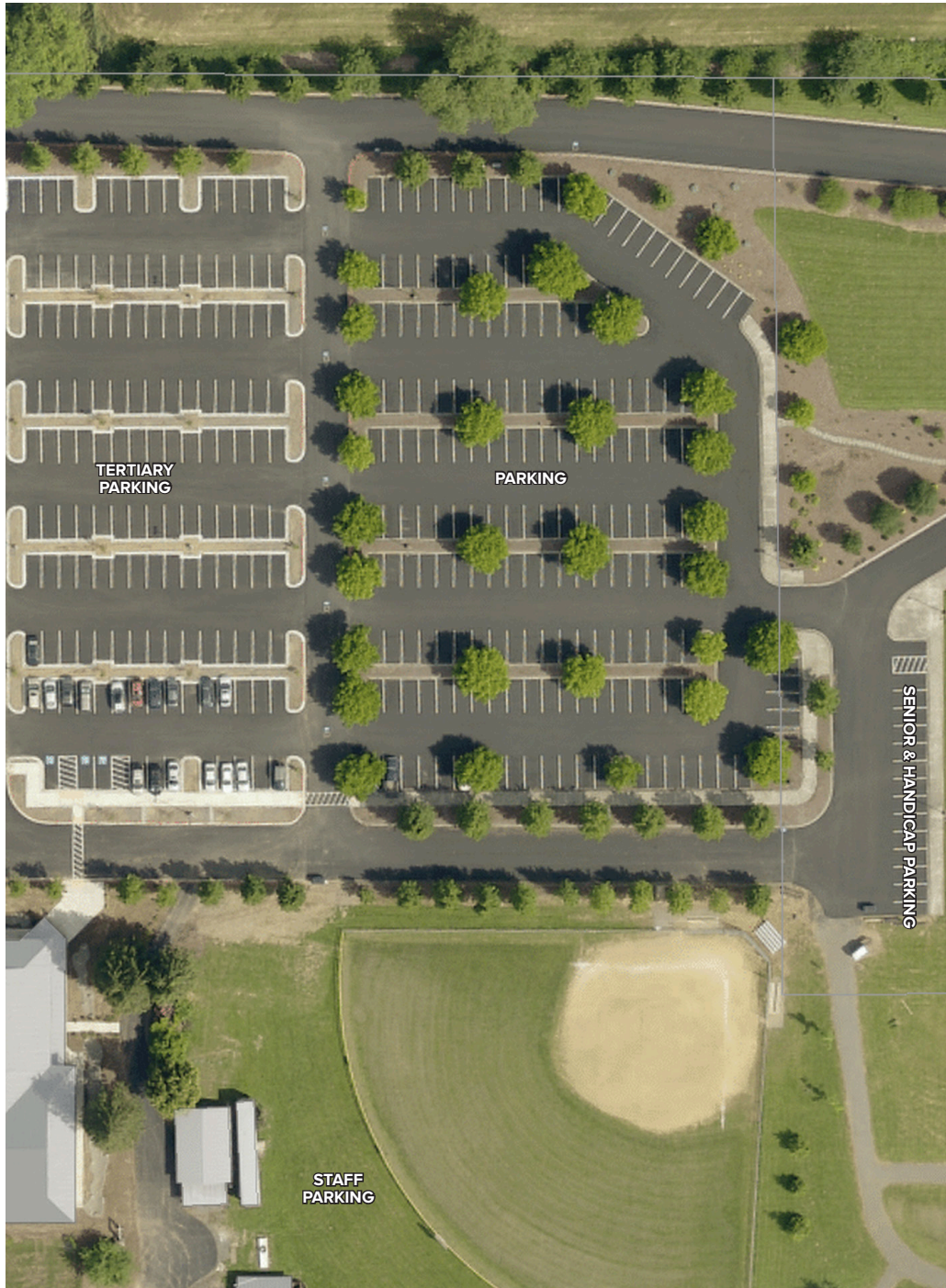

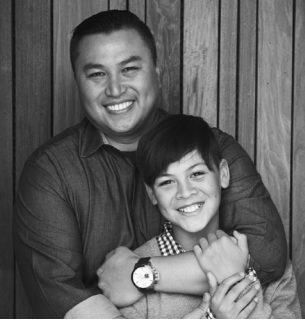
## **Dave Merritt**

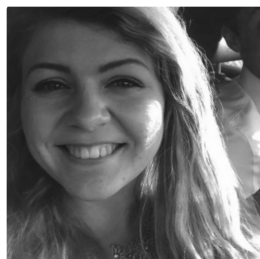
## **Chart Tiantawach**
