Sex is ______.

In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no one ever hated his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, just as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body. "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and hold fast to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." Ephesians 5:28-31

The husband should give to his wife her conjugal rights, and likewise the wife to her husband. For the wife does not have authority over her own body, but the husband does. Likewise the husband does not have authority over his own body, but the wife does.1 Corinthians 7:3-4

- Sex is ______; it involves the body, mind and soul. There is no such things as "it's just sex."
 - God made Adam and Eve physically (out of dust/rib), emotional (able to have deep philosophical thought), and spiritual (with a soul).

But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart. Matthew 5:28

"Food is meant for the stomach and the stomach for food"—and God will destroy both one and the other. The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body. And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. 1 Corinthians 6:13-14

One flesh is the reason the gospel has boundaries for sex. These boundaries are for the good of humanity, the joy of creation and the glory of God. When understood and upheld, humanity flourishes.

	Flee from sexual immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the sexually immoral person sins against his own body. 1 Corinthians 6:18

The Gospel Celebration of Sex

Let marriage be held in honor among all, and let the marriage bed be undefiled... Hebrews 13:4

Young men in Jewish culture were not able to read Song of Solomon until adulthood.

Song of Solomon is a poetic and erotic piece of the wisdom literature in the Bible. It is not symbolism for the rest of Scripture; this is the relationship between a man and his wife.

[HE] How beautiful and pleasant you are, O loved one, with all your delights! Your stature is like a palm tree, and your breasts are like its clusters. I say I will climb the palm tree and lay hold of its fruit. Oh may your breasts be like clusters of the vine, and the scent of your breath like apples, and your mouth like the best wine. [SHE] It goes down smoothly for my beloved, gliding over lips and teeth. I am my beloved's, and his desire is for me. Song of Solomon 7:6-10

Song of Solomon shows us the celebration of sexual love. It illustrates Genesis 2:24-25.
