#### **GROWING DEEPER**

The Summit View Church family will spend the next four weeks addressing issues of manhood, womanhood, singleness, sexuality and marriage. Why do these topics matter to those who follow Jesus? What good things could come into your life, your family, our church and our community through the study of these important topics?

What comes to mind when you hear the phrase biblical manhood? What was your experience of manhood and what it meant to be a man growing up? How did your childhood experiences shape the way you interacted with men?

Read Genesis 3:6 and Philippians 2:6-8 and contrast the manhood demonstrated by Adam and Jesus.

The first Adam fell into passivity. The second Adam, Jesus, rejected passivity. How was Adam passive in the Genesis narrative? Yale sociologist Steven Clark said, "For whatever reason, men have a natural tendency to avoid social responsibility." How is this passivity and avoidance seen and even celebrated in our culture? How is passivity seen in the church? How can we encourage men to follow Jesus' example? What rewards and difficulties come from following Jesus' example?


The first Adam disregarded his responsibilities. The second Adam, Jesus, accepted responsibility. Discuss this statement from writer Roy Smith, "The ability to accept responsibility is always the measure of a man." In Genesis 2-3, God gives Adam a law to obey, a work to do and a woman to love. What does Adam do with each of these responsibilities? How does Jesus fulfill each of these responsibilities? How do we create, cultivate and defend a culture of industry and nobility among God's men?

The first Adam abandoned his post of leadership. The second Adam chose to lead courageously. Jesus's leadership is seen in the powerful biblical metaphor of his leading as a shepherd in John 10:11. How does Jesus know, lead, feed and protect us, his sheep? What can we learn and apply from Jesus' leadership of his people?

The first Adam sought a greater reward, the second Adam expected a greater reward. The first Adam fell into temptation because he sought something other than God's best but Jesus' obedience was motivated by God's reward (Hebrews 12:1-2). What are some common temptations of modern manhood? How can the promises, rewards and motivation of God help equip men to fight against these temptations?
