GROWING DEEPER

The #1 enemy that can defeat our effectiveness and growth this time of year is excuses. Good excuses rarely collect dust because we use them often. Which of these common excuses do you find yourself using? The task is too demanding; my talent is inadequate; the time is not right; the task is too costly; do I have to go now?

Excuse #1: The task is too demanding (Jeremiah 1:5)

What tasks, opportunities and responsibilities has God provided for you in 2017?

How was Jeremiah's task of becoming a prophet demanding? What did the people think of Jeremiah's message? How should God's foreknowledge of our calling and abilities affect our excuses?

Excuse #2: My talent is inadequate (Jeremiah 1:6)

How does Paul address this excuse in 2 Corinthians 12:9? How can our perceived disadvantages actually function as spiritual advantages? How have you seen God use you or others despite weaknesses?

Excuse #3: The time is not right (Jeremiah 1:6-7)

It's often said that If you wait for the right time, you'll never go. What opportunities or tasks remain unfinished in your life? How does God answer Jeremiah's excuse that he is too young; what can we learn from it?

Excuse #4: The task is too costly (Jeremiah 1:13)

God used the image of a boiling pot to communicate coming wrath. Jeremiah's task was not convenient, but costly. What will it cost to obey what God is calling you to do? Why are the most important tasks usually the most costly?

Excuse #5: Do I have to go now? (Jeremiah 1:17)

How is delayed obedience a form of disobedience? Why is immediate obedience important to God? How does immediate obedience shape us? How has hesitation ended up costing you more than immediate obedience?
