God made women with unique form and equal worth (Genesis 1:26-28). How has our understanding of womanhood changed through the generations? Genesis 1:26-28 describes manhood and womanhood as having equal value by being made in the image of God and yet each has distinct and complementary roles in fulfilling the cultural mandate. Why is it crucial to understand that our value isn't based on our gender? How do we cultivate a culture of valuing and esteeming God's design for the sexes in our marriage, family, CARE Group and community?

God made women with unique fit (Genesis 1:27-28).

According to the scriptures, God's divine image is represented in both male and female. Why is it important to see distinction in men and women as a design to be celebrated? How do both manhood and womanhood uniquely express the image of God? Highlight the verbs within this text and discuss how God uses both male and female to fulfill the tasks given to humanity. If Adam is incomplete without a helper, what do we learn about the designed complementarity of the sexes? Because God identifies Himself as a helper in Exodus, 18:4, Deuteronomy 33:7 and Psalm 33:20, what can we learn about the value and role of a helper from the scriptures?


God made women with a unique focus (Genesis 3:4-6).

Eve believed the lie that to be like God would be better and more fulfilling than how God designed her. Satan appealed to her sense of sight (comparison) and desire for knowledge/equality with God (perfectionism). How do these specific temptations affect women today? Proverbs 31:30-31 shows us that bodies deteriorate but character develops; how can we invest in what lasts? What would practically need to change in your day to day life to break the fixation on outer appearance and begin cultivating the inner person?

God made women to reflect a unique grace (Genesis 3:16 and Romans 8:22). Eve was designed to be a life-giver; the mother of all living. Women possess the incredible gift to nurture. What examples, either in your life or in church history, come to mind of biblical women nurturing others? How does this nurture cause others to flourish? How can the design to nurture be twisted by sin?


