Have someone read each of the verses that were highlighted in the message, and briefly discuss.

Is there an area that you feel God is speaking to you through this message?

FINAL THOUGHTS:

- SUMMARIZE the main idea of this message.

Would anyone like to share your thoughts about what we discussed today? How can we pray for you as a group?

If anyone else thinks he has reason for confidence in the flesh, I have more: circumcised on the eighth day, of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of Hebrews (confidence in his nationality); as to the law, a Pharisee (confidence in his status and education); as to zeal, a persecutor of the church (confidence in his passion for God); as to righteousness under the law, blameless.(confidence in his observance of the law). But whatever gain I had (whatever my achievements and accomplishments), I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish (Paul gave up everything he used to put his confidence in – nationality, status, achievements, passions, good works), in order that I may gain Christ and be found in him..."

These aren't the things we do to be saved, these are the things we do because we are saved!
