EASTER 2018

STARTER QUESTION:

Have you ever worked long and hard to create something, say like a "Bible study" for example and wonder, "Will anyone even read this?"

It's **EASTER** people! Time to be with family and friends.

MAIN IDEA:

Easter is a time to remember traditions that you have learned from your family and to teach them to those who have not heard them yet.

Proverbs 22:6 (NIV)

"Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it"

There is an Easter tradition that is spoken in over 250 different languages all over the world. It is called the "Paschal Greeting" or "Easter Acclamation". Although there are many different forms of this greeting, they are all summarily to the English version with one person starting the greeting by saying: "Christ is risen!" and the response is "He is risen indeed".

Both the greeting and response is based on scripture. (Read Mark 16:6 and Luke 24:34.)

Tradition states that saying this greeting is a way to start a discussion about the Resurrection; much as it was during the time of the disciples.

If you were to start a discussion about Christ's Resurrection how would you begin?

How would you start a discussion about Christ's Resurrection with a child?

It is important to remember that you don't need to be an expert on the Bible, just an expert on what the Resurrected Christ has done in your life. This type of discussion is often open, honest and life changing. Think about those who need to hear what you have to say and make a commitment to start the discussion. Even people who would not have gone to church on Easter morning would probably accept an invite to Easter dinner.

There are a lot of other Easter traditions that you could use to help open people's minds, but not every tradition is sound or useful. If you are not sure what your tradition is based on, you might have to do a little digging on the internet to see if it fits into Biblical facts.

There is nothing wrong with tradition as long as it does not get in the way of the truth.
