- READ THE MAIN SCRIPTURE FROM THE MESSAGE OUTLINE.

How did this verse speak to you in your life?

REVIEW THE SUB-TOPICS of the MESSAGE.

Have someone read each of the verses that were highlighted in the message, and briefly discuss.

Is there an area that you feel God is speaking to you through this message?

#### **FINAL THOUGHTS:**

SUMMARIZE the main idea of this message.

Would anyone like to share your thoughts about what we discussed today? How can we pray for you as a group?

## I BELIEVE, BUT...

"I can't make a good case for the existence of God."

In the Bible, there are examples of both an acceptable and unacceptable kind of testing God.

"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this,' says the Lord Almighty, 'and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it." Malachi 3:10 (NIV)

Jesus - "The Scriptures also say, 'You must not test the Lord your God."" - Matt. 4:7 (NLT)

Arguments for God's existence apart from the Bible:

Cosmological Argument

Cosmology is the study of the origin of the universe.

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth." - Genesis 1:1 (NLT)

Question to consider: What could cause a universe to come into existence? In answer...

"It must be immaterial or spirit because it existed before the material world. It must be eternal because it created time. It must be very smart and very powerful because of the precision and the power it would take to create the universe. It must have a personal will, because it had to make the decision to create. And then the Principle of Occam's Razor tells us that there must be just one creator." -Lee Strobel

• <u>Teleo</u>logical Argument – How can we explain the obvious purposeful and intricate <u>design</u> of the world?

"How many are Your works, O Lord! In wisdom You made them all; the earth is full of Your creatures." - Ps. 104:24 (NIV)

Moral Argument - Where did our innate sense of right and wrong come from?

"Let justice roll down like waters, and righteousness like an ever-flowing stream." - Amos 5:24 (ESV)
