SAUL TO PAUL "Surviving the Storm" (Acts 27)

"A wind of hurricane force, called the Northeaster, swept down from the island. The ship was caught by the storm..." Acts 27:14-15 (NIV)

What gets us into trouble:

1. We follow bad <u>advice</u>. v. 11 *"...they followed the advice of the* (ship's) *pilot…"*

2. We follow the crowd. v. 12 "the majority decided that we should sail..."

3. We rely only on <u>circumstances</u>. v. 13 *"When a gentle south wind began to blow, they saw their opportunity; so they weighed anchor and sailed..."*

"When the sentence for a crime is not quickly carried out, people's hearts are filled with schemes to do wrong." Ecc 8:11 (NIV)

Things you tend to do when you go through difficult storms:

• Just <u>Drift</u> along.

v. 15 "so we gave way to it and were driven along".

• Throw away <u>valuable</u> things.

v. 18 "...then began to throw the cargo overboard..."

- Give up hope.
- v. 20 "we finally gave up all hope of being saved."

"Fearing that we would be dashed against the rocks, they dropped four anchors from the stern and prayed for daylight." Acts 27:29 (NIV)
