Generosity: having a heart to give freely and offer help to others "Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." 2 Corinthians 9:7

IMPACT – *Diversity*

STARTER QUESTIONS:

When you think of riches, what are the first things that come to mind? Finances? Material possessions?

Do you feel rich, or do you find yourselves wishing for more?

Ecclesiastes 5:10 says, "Whoever loves money never has enough; whoever loves wealth is never satisfied with their income. This too is meaningless." Hank said, "The desire to feel wealthy causes us problems." Do you agree with that statement?

Hank mentioned that if you make \$45,000 annually, you're in the top 1% of wage earners world wide. How does this affect your personal definition of "rich?"

KEY SCRIPTURE:

1 Timothy 6:17-19 (TLB)

"Tell those who are rich not to be proud and not to trust in their money, which will soon be gone, but their pride and trust should be in the living God who always richly gives us all we need for our enjoyment. Tell them to use their money to do good. They should be rich in good works and should give happily to those in need, always being ready to share with others whatever God has given them. By doing this they will be storing up real treasure for themselves in heaven--it is the only safe investment for eternity! And they will be living a fruitful Christian life down here as well." Let's look at some main points from this week's message:

How we are to Give:

• <u>Thoughtfully</u> "...make up your own mind..."

• Enthusiastically "... not reluctantly..."

• <u>Voluntarily</u> "... not in response to pressure..."

• <u>Cheerfully</u> "God loves the person who gives cheerfully"

But how can you really give cheerfully?

"They should be rich in good works and should give happily to those in need, always being ready to share with others <u>whatever God has given</u> them. By doing this they will be <u>storing up real treasure for</u> <u>themselves in heaven</u>--it is the only safe investment for eternity! And they will be <u>living a fruitful</u> <u>Christian life</u> down here as well." 1 Timothy 6:18-19 (TLB) 1. Remember it all comes from <u>God.</u>

"...share with others whatever God has given..." (vs.18)

2. Remember your eternal reward.

"...storing up real treasure for themselves in heaven it is the only safe investment for eternity!" (vs.19a)

3. Remember why you're still here.

...be living a fruitful Christian life" (vs.19b)
