**How did this verse speak to you in your life?**

- REVIEW THE SUB-TOPICS of the MESSAGE.

Have someone read each of the verses that were highlighted in the message, and briefly discuss.

**Is there an area that you feel God is speaking to you through this message?**

### FINAL THOUGHTS:

- SUMMARIZE the main idea of this message.

**Would anyone like to share your thoughts about what we discussed today?**

**How can we pray for you as a group?**

## SEVEN LAST WORDS

### “I Thirst”

*“Knowing that all was now completed, and so that the Scripture would be fulfilled, Jesus said, “I am thirsty.”* John 19:28 (NIV)

Greek: “Dipsao” = “I Thirst”

*Theanthropic* = embodying deity in a human form;  
both divine and human. (God-Man)

Jesus as Human (“I Thirst”)

### Jesus knows what it means to be human...

- He was angry (John 2)
- He was sad (John 11)
- He got irritated (Matthew 17)
- He was tempted (Matthew 4)

Jesus as Divine (“...that the Scripture would be fulfilled.”)

*“Knowing that all was now completed, and so that the Scripture would be fulfilled, Jesus said, “I am thirsty.” A jar of wine vinegar was there, so they soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a stalk of the hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus' lips.”* John 19:28, 29 (NIV)

*“They... gave me vinegar for my thirst.”*

Psalm 69:21 (NIV)
