3. David was a king who already "had it all," yet when he saw Bathsheba, he still wanted more and fell into sin. What do you think contributes to someone who seems to have everything still desiring more? And what practical steps can we take to guard ourselves from falling into similar temptations?
4. As a group, read 2 Samuel 12: 9-10 (NIV) aloud, and respond to the following: describe how you think David felt in the moment, when he was told, "the sword shall never depart from your house."
5. Knowing the story of David, Bathsheba, as well as Joab's involvement, which of those characters can you most relate to and why?
