STUDY GUIDE

Leadership Tip:

While we study how to better listen for God's voice, also take the time to listen to the prayers and concerns of your group members.

THE VOICE -- RECOGNITION

STARTER QUESTIONS:

Has there ever been a time when you had trouble determining whether a voice was God's or the enemy's?

When you think of times when God spoke to people in the Bible, what is one of the first stories that comes to mind? Why?

Why is it important to discuss God's voice with your LIFE group?

MAIN IDEA:

In our current series titled, "The Voice," we are learning about the different ways God speaks to us, and how to decipher between God's voice and the enemy's voice. Pastor Hank said, "If you aren't willing to listen to everything God has to say, you eventually won't hear anything He has to say. If you want to hear His comforting voice, you have to listen to His convicting voice. And it's often what we want to hear least, that we need to hear most."

KEY VERSE:

Jesus: "Who do you say that I am?" - Matthew 16:15 (NLT)

Pastor Hank addressed five questions to ask yourself, when you're not sure if a voice is God's or the enemy's:

1. Does it agree with the Bible?

"Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will never pass away." Luke 21:33 (NIV)

Who can you turn to, or would you turn to, if you were unsure whether or not the voice you heard agrees with the Bible?

2. Am I elevating how I feel above what God says to be true?

"Jesus said to His disciples, 'There will always be temptations to sin, but what sorrow awaits the person who does the tempting!" Luke 17:1 (NLT)

Has there ever been a time when you may have claimed a voice was God, in order to gain your own desires?

3. Will it make me more like Jesus?

"In your lives you must think and act like Jesus Christ." Philippians 2:5 (NCV)

"If you harbor bitter envy and selfish ambition... such 'wisdom' is of the devil. The wisdom that comes from God is pure, peace loving, considerate, submissive, full of mercy, impartial and sincere." James 3:14-17 (NIV)

Have you ever heard an impression that was from bitter envy or selfish ambition? How did you handle it? How were you sure it wasn't from God?

4. Do Godly people confirm it?

"The wisdom of the righteous can save you."

Proverbs 11:9 (GN)

Pastor Hank said, "God never meant for you to go through life on your own. That's why He created the church family, because we need each other." That's why we have LIFE groups!

"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" Psalm 133:1 (NIV)

Ask someone to find, and read aloud, Proverbs 19:20-21 (NIV).

5. What is the tone of that impression?

"Have you sensed God saying anything encouraging to you lately? Or is it all about pressure? ... Listen for context clues." Pastor Hank

"Satan wants to drive us compulsively, but God desires to draw us compassionately." Pastor Hank

What are some examples of a voice with Jesus-like compassion? What has He said to you lately? Has Satan ever tried to drive you compulsively?

FINAL THOUGHTS:

The Lord speaks to people of all nations, and of all ages, we need only listen.

READ 1 Samuel 3:9 (NASB):

"Speak, Lord, for Your servant is listening."

And also Proverbs 2:1-5 (ESV):

"My son, if you receive my words and treasure up my commandments with you, making your ear attentive to wisdom and inclining your heart to understanding; yes, if you call out insight and raise your voice for understanding, if you seek it like silver and search for it as hidden treasures, then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God."
