## ALL TO JESUS

### A sermon series from Colossians

### GROUP DISCUSSION:

Read Colossians 1:1-8

What sticks out to you from this passage or the sermon?

The Colossian believers were under pressure from false teachers who wanted to draw them away from the truths of scripture. What are some ways that our culture comes against the truth of the gospel? What is the best way to handle these threats?

The gospel is active in your life and will always bear fruit in you when you engage with it. Is this encouraging to you? How so? What fruit are you seeing God grow in your life?

The hope of the gospel is that because Christ is in you, you will be welcomed into his eternal kingdom and will share in His glory forever. How does living out of this hope change the way you live? How does this big picture of the gospel reorient your priorities and your decisions?

(Feel free to read ahead this week! I encourage you to read the book of Colossians many times this summer!)
