Seaside Church Sermon Notes

<u>DISCIPLES: A Series on Following Jesus Together in the Local Church</u> 1 - Receive the Gospel

SUMMARY

This is the first of a 6 week series on the basics of following Jesus in the local church. A disciple is a learner or follower of Christ and we've chosen 6 action steps as headers to walk through a basic picture of what this looks like. The first step is... receive the gospel. Sunday's message was focused on how Jesus began preaching the gospel and the response he was looking for from his followers. We also covered 5 different ways this can look in our lives. Not everyone has the same experience in receiving the gospel, but some things remain the same in all of our stories. In order to begin following Jesus, you first have to receive the gospel!

GROUP QUESTIONS (For use with your family, roommates, Community or Bible Group, or individually)

- Share something from the message or passage that surprised, encouraged, or troubled you.
- When you think about someone receiving the gospel, getting saved, becoming a Christian, etc... what first comes to mind as far as what that looks like?
- Read Mark 1.14-15. When Jesus begins preaching the gospel, what does he emphasize? Is that different from what we emphasize in a typical "gospel presentation" today?
- Pastor Rob mentioned 5 example stories of different ways people received the gospel in the New Testament.
- The "not yet believer" Samaritan Woman/John 4
- The "religious" Lydia/Acts 16.11-15
- The "seeker" Ethiopian Eunuch/Acts 8.26-39
- The "christian kid" Timothy/2 Timothy 1.5; Acts 16.1-2
- The "Processor" The 12 Disciples/Matthew, Mark, Luke, John
- Share which one of these you relate to and why.
- While we and the examples above have different stories in how we received the gospel, what the things we have in common?
- If you've never written out your story. Take time this week and write out how you became a follower of Jesus. You can follow a three step process.
- 1. Write about your life before becoming a Christian
 - 2. Write about the circumstances around how you heard the gospel and believed it
- 3. Write about what the Lord is doing in your life now
- If you you've never taken time in your Community Group to share your stories, take the fall to have one person share their story each week during your group time

PRAYER POINT

Have you received the gospel? If not, and you desire to express your faith in Christ, do so together in prayer. If you have received the gospel, remember your story. Thank God for the people he used to bring you to faith. Pray for them by name. Also, have you made Christianity into something that doesn't start here? Rest in the simplicity of this beginning point of discipleship. We don't just receive the gospel once... but continue to repent and believe. Practice those actions as well in prayer.

FOR FAMILIES WITH KIDS

Read 1 Corinthians 15.1-6. Help your kids clearly understand the gospel message. Now read Mark 1.14-15. Explain to your kids the response Jesus calls us to. If they are ready, help them receive the gospel and become disciples of Jesus.
