# ALL TO JESUS

## Colossians 2:1-5

## GROUP DISCUSSION:

Read Colossians 2:1-5

What stuck out to you from this passage or sermon? How should you respond to this truth?

### Discipleship:

Describe your experience with being disciplined when you were a new believer? Who disciplined you? What has stuck with you from that experience?

Is there someone you are (or could be) discipling now? What are some key things about Jesus that you want to share with others?

### The Greatest Treasure:

Paul said that God's treasures of wisdom and knowledge are found in Jesus (v.3), and so believers have access to this treasure. In what ways have you found God's wisdom and knowledge to be treasures in your life?

Read Proverbs 3:13-15. Why do you think the writer of this Proverb said that wisdom is greater than anything else a person could desire?

### False Treasure:

Paul didn't want the Colossians to be deceived by "plausible arguments" which sounded like wisdom but were actually lies that would pull them away from Jesus. What are some "plausible arguments" in our day that sound good to many people, but are actually contrary to God's word?

There is a battle for our minds. What are some ways we can win this battle, and keep our thoughts in line with God's word?
