## READINGS:

### Isaiah 1:10a, 11-20

[10] Hear the word of the LORD...

[11] "What to me is the multitude of your sacrifices?

says the LORD;

I have had enough of burnt offerings of rams  
and the fat of well-fed beasts;

I do not delight in the blood of bulls,  
or of lambs, or of goats.

[12] "When you come to appear before me,  
who has required of you  
this trampling of my courts?

[13] Bring no more vain offerings;  
incense is an abomination to me.

New moon and Sabbath and the calling of  
convocations—

I cannot endure iniquity and solemn assembly.

[14] Your new moons and your appointed feasts  
my soul hates;

they have become a burden to me;  
I am weary of bearing them.

[15] When you spread out your hands,  
I will hide my eyes from you;

even though you make many prayers,  
I will not listen;  
your hands are full of blood.

[16] Wash yourselves; make yourselves clean;  
remove the evil of your deeds from before

my eyes;  
cease to do evil,

[17] learn to do good;  
seek justice,

correct oppression;

bring justice to the fatherless,  
plead the widow's cause.

[18] "Come now, let us reason together, says  
the LORD:

though your sins are like scarlet,  
they shall be as white as snow;  
though they are red like crimson,  
they shall become like wool.

[19] If you are willing and obedient,  
you shall eat the good of the land;

[20] but if you refuse and rebel,  
you shall be eaten by the sword;  
for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.

### Psalm 32

[1] Blessed is the one whose transgression is  
forgiven,  
whose sin is covered.

[2] Blessed is the man against whom the LORD  
counts no iniquity,  
and in whose spirit there is no deceit.

[3] For when I kept silent, my bones wasted  
away  
through my groaning all day long.

[4] For day and night your hand was heavy upon  
me;  
my strength was dried up as by the heat  
of summer.

[5] I acknowledged my sin to you,

and I did not cover my iniquity;  
I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD,"

and you forgave the iniquity of my sin.  
[6] Therefore let everyone who is godly  
offer prayer to you at a time when you  
may be found;  
surely in the rush of great waters,  
they shall not reach him.

[7] You are a hiding place for me;  
you preserve me from trouble;  
you surround me with shouts of  
deliverance.

[8] I will instruct you and teach you in the way  
you should go;

I will counsel you with my eye upon you.

[9] Be not like a horse or a mule, without  
understanding,  
which must be curbed with bit and  
bridle,

or it will not stay near you.

[10] Many are the sorrows of the wicked,  
but steadfast love surrounds the one  
who trusts in the LORD.

[11] Be glad in the LORD, and rejoice, O  
righteous,  
and shout for joy, all you upright in heart

## 2 Thessalonians 1

[1] Paul, Silvanus, and Timothy,

To the church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:

[2] Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

[3] We ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers, as is right, because your faith is growing abundantly, and the love of every one of you for one another is increasing. [4] Therefore we ourselves boast about you in the churches of God for your steadfastness and faith in all your persecutions and in the afflictions that you are enduring.

[5] This is evidence of the righteous judgment of God, that you may be considered worthy of the kingdom of God, for which you are also suffering—[6] since indeed God considers it just to repay with affliction those who afflict you, [7] and to grant relief to you who are afflicted as well as to us, when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven with his mighty angels [8] in flaming fire, inflicting vengeance on those who do not know God and on those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. [9] They will suffer the punishment of eternal destruction, away from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of his might, [10] when he comes on that day to be glorified in his saints, and to be marveled at among all who have believed, because our testimony to you was believed. [11] To this end we always pray for you, that our God may make you worthy of his calling and may fulfill every resolve for good and every work of faith by his power, [12] so that the name of our Lord Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.

## Luke 19:1-10

[1] He entered Jericho and was passing through. [2] And behold, there was a man named Zacchaeus. He was a chief tax collector and was rich. [3] And he was seeking to see who Jesus was, but on account of the crowd he could not, because he was small in stature. [4] So he ran on ahead and climbed up into a sycamore tree to see him, for he was about to pass that way. [5] And when Jesus came to the place, he looked up and said to him, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down, for I must stay at your house today." [6] So he hurried and came down and received him joyfully. [7] And when they saw it, they all grumbled, "He has gone in to be the guest of a man who is a sinner." [8] And Zacchaeus stood and said to the Lord, "Behold, Lord, the half of my goods I give to the poor. And if I have defrauded anyone of anything, I restore it fourfold." [9] And Jesus said to him, "Today salvation has come to this house, since he also is a son of Abraham. [10] For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost."
