GROUP DISCUSSION:

Read Jonah 1:1-16

What stands out to you personally from this story?

What's significant about the writer saying that Jonah was "fleeing God's presence" and not simply "fleeing God's command?"

How is your heart right now? Are you in a place of running from God? Sometimes the running is clear and other times we can hide our rebellion behind our religion. Consider the hypocrisy of Jonah (1:9) as well as Jesus' words in Matthew 15:7-8 in your response.

Who is the hero in this story? How would that land on the heart of a loyal Israelite sitting around the campfire hearing this story for the first time?
