READINGS:

Job 19:23-27

[23] "Oh, that my words were recorded,
that they were written on a scroll,
[24] that they were inscribed with an iron
tool on lead,
or engraved in rock forever!
[25] I know that my redeemer lives,
and that in the end he will stand on the
earth.
[26] And after my skin has been destroyed,
yet in my flesh I will see God;
[27] I myself will see him
with my own eyes—I, and not another.
How my heart yearns within me! [NIV]

Psalms 17

[1] Hear a just cause, O LORD; attend to my
cry!
Give ear to my prayer from lips free of
deceit!
[2] From your presence let my vindication
come!
Let your eyes behold the right!
[3] You have tried my heart, you have visited
me by night,

you have tested me, and you will find
nothing;

I have purposed that my mouth will not
transgress.

[4] With regard to the works of man, by the
word of your lips

I have avoided the ways of the violent.

[5] My steps have held fast to your paths;
my feet have not slipped.

[6] I call upon you, for you will answer me, O
God;

incline your ear to me; hear my words.

[7] Wondrously show your steadfast love,
O Savior of those who seek refuge
from their adversaries at your right hand.

[8] Keep me as the apple of your eye;
hide me in the shadow of your wings,

[9] from the wicked who do me violence,
my deadly enemies who surround me.

[10] They close their hearts to pity;
with their mouths they speak arrogantly.

[11] They have now surrounded our steps;

they set their eyes to cast us to the ground.

[12] He is like a lion eager to tear,
as a young lion lurking in ambush.

[13] Arise, O LORD! Confront him, subdue him!

Deliver my soul from the wicked by your sword,

[14] from men by your hand, O LORD,

from men of the world whose portion is in this life.

You fill their womb with treasure;
they are satisfied with children,
and they leave their abundance to their infants.

[15] As for me, I shall behold your face in righteousness;

when I awake, I shall be satisfied with your likeness. [ESV]

2 Thessalonians 2:13-3:5

[13] But we ought always to give thanks to God for you, brothers beloved by the Lord, because God chose you as the firstfruits to be saved, through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth. [14] To this he called you through our gospel, so that you may obtain the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ. [15] So then, brothers, stand firm and hold to the traditions that you were taught by us, either by our spoken word or by our letter.

[16] Now may our Lord Jesus Christ himself, and God our Father, who loved us and gave us eternal comfort and good hope through grace, [17] comfort your hearts and establish them in every good work and word.

[3.1] Finally, brothers, pray for us, that the word of the Lord may speed ahead and be honored, as happened among you, [2] and that we may be delivered from wicked and evil men. For not all have faith. [3] But the Lord is faithful. He will establish you and guard you against the evil one. [4] And we have confidence in the Lord about you, that you are doing and will do the things that we command. [5] May the Lord direct your hearts to the love of God and to the steadfastness of Christ. [ESV]

Luke 20:27-38

[27] There came to him some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, [28] and they asked him a question, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us that if a man's brother dies, having a wife but no children, the man must take the widow and raise up offspring for his brother. [29] Now there were seven brothers. The first took a wife, and died without children. [30] And the second [31] and the third took her, and likewise all seven left no children and died. [32] Afterward the woman also died. [33] In the resurrection, therefore, whose wife will the woman be? For the seven had her as wife."

[34] And Jesus said to them, "The sons of this age marry and are given in marriage, [35] but those who are considered worthy to attain to that age and to the resurrection from the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage, [36] for they cannot die anymore, because they are equal to angels and are sons of God, being sons of the resurrection. [37] But that the dead are raised, even Moses showed, in the passage about the bush, where he calls the Lord the God of Abraham and the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob. [38] Now he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for all live to him." [ESV]
