GROUP DISCUSSION:

Read Acts 6:8-15.

Do you think we can be tempted to love our own cultural, national, political, ethnic, etc. identity more than God? If so, how and why do you think that is?

Summarize the story of Israel according to Stephen's speech (Acts 7:1-53). What is his point in covering all this content?

Why is losing actually winning in the Kingdom of God?

What do you think was happening in Stephen's heart and mind to be able to say what he did in verse 60? Could you do the same to your enemies?

Read Acts 8:1-4. Why is this the tipping point? What stands out to you here?
