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- ...to prepare us to share in Christ's glory Romans 8:16-18; 2 Corinthians 4:16-18; 1 Peter 4:13
- 2. God provides <u>wisdom</u> in our trials—the <u>skill</u> to see them and respond to them as <u>Jesus</u> would if he were living your life. (1:5-8; cp. 1 Corinthians 1:24)
  - God gives wisdom <u>generously</u> (cp. Romans 8:32; Hebrews 11:6; Proverbs 1:7 et al; Psalm 33:18; 118;4; 147:1 the fear of the Lord = hope in his unfailing love; James 1:17)

- God gives wisdom without <u>finding fault</u>
