2. The World (4:4-5)

"world"

James is NOT saying we must not be friends with people in the world, but rather we must not adopt the values of the world.

"adulterous...friendship with the world" (cp. John 14:30; 2 Corinthians 4:4; Galatians 1:4; 1 John 5:19)

James is talking about believers carrying on an "illicit affair" with the values of secular society. The sins of adultery and murder are as much a matter of the heart as they are of one's hands; they can be committed <u>internally</u>, without doing them <u>externally</u>.

4:5 "He yearns jealously over "the spirit" that he has made to dwell in us?"

Three main views:

- 1. God yearns jealously for his Holy Spirit indwelling us, when we use our bodies to sin.
- 2. God yearns for our spirit as a heart-broken spouse yearns for an unfaithful mate. (cp. Exodus 20:4-5; 34:12-14)
- 3. The spirit of fallen man yearns with envy.

The point of all three is the same: Our flesh and the world are hostile to God, and God opposes those who embrace either over him. The really good news: God has more *grace* than we have *sin!* (Romans 5:20; John 1:16)

3. The Devil (4:6-10)

God's grace gives us the power to <u>overcome</u> our enemies—the power to live free of our flesh, unfriend the world, and stand strong against the devil. That grace is available only to the <u>humble</u>.
