Even the GodMan, the Lord Jesus Christ, in all that he is and accomplished in his sinless life and miraculous works, gave the credit to his Father in heaven (John 5:19, 30; 6:57; 7:16; 8:28-29; 10:32; 12:49-50; 14:10) and did it all for the Father's glory (John 12:28; 13:31-32; 14:13; 17:4).

Yahweh's Glory Made Known - Exodus 14

Yahweh's Passion for His Glory to Be Known – Exodus 6:7 "You shall know that I am Yahweh your God, who has brought you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians." (cf. 7:5, 17; 8:10, 33; 9:16, 29; 10:2; 14:4, 18)

Matthew 1:21 The name, Jesus, comes from the Hebrew name, Joshua, which means "Yahweh saves" or "Yahweh is salvation".

Philippians 2:11 "Every knee will bow and tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." A quote from **Isaiah 45:23** where Yahweh is the one to whom every knee shall bow and every tongue confess.

John 12:27-28 "Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But for this purpose I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name." Then a voice came from heaven: "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again."

Jonathan Edwards' Sermon Notes on Psalm 115:1 and What It Means for Believers to Give Glory to God

They love to attribute to God the glory of what they are, what they have, and what they do.

They delight in giving the praise of all that they have, all that they are, and all that they enjoy to God in acknowledging that it comes from him, and that it is all the fruit of his generosity and is not owing to themselves. That it is not owing to their own strength to get it or to their own merit to deserve it, but alone to the power of God and mercy of God in being willing to bestow it, and to his power in procuring it...thus they love to give God the glory of all their temporal things. Even in their common enjoyments, they are not as some, living continually on the bounty of God and not once considering who they are owing to, nor sincerely once praising him for them. But especially is the joy of their heart to give God all the glory of their spiritual enjoyments.

They love to give God the whole praise of their redemption and salvation, admire God's goodness in electing them from all eternity. They wonder at God's goodness in sending his Son to redeem them, and likewise admire at his grace in calling them to Christ by his Holy Spirit. They delight to acknowledge that their conversion is not at all owing in any respect to themselves but to God alone and the grace of God alone. So they love to give God the glory of all his works whereby glory redounds to God. They are not for attributing anything to their own power or goodness.

When they overcome a temptation, they exalt God that his grace was sufficient for them; when they do a good work by feeding the poor or otherwise, they take none of the glory of it to themselves, as if they had done some great thing that made them worthy of God's love, and therefore they will do it as secretly as possibly they can. For they know that is only their duty. They desire not that any should know of it but God, and to him they will say, "Not unto me, O Lord, not unto me, but unto your name be the glory for you have enabled me to do any good work."

Exodus 3

What Does It Mean That God's name is *HE IS* (Yahweh) and in referring to himself he explains that as I AM or I AM WHO I AM?

God is the <u>Self-existent One</u>—that is the foundation of all his glory:

That God's name is "HE IS" means... (John Piper)

- ...God never had a **beginning** and will never have an **end**.
- ...God is absolute reality.
- ...God is utterly independent.
- ...everything that is not God depends totally on God. (Isaiah 40:17).
- ...God is **constant**.
- ...God is the absolute **standard** of truth, goodness and beauty.
- ...God does whatever he pleases and it is always right and beautiful and in accord with truth.
- ...God is the most important and most valuable reality, the most important and most valuable person in the universe.
