- Christ followers will certainly never face God's wrath in hell, but that doesn't mean we will not face his anger and judgment in the form of severe, yet loving, discipline. (cf. Hebrews 12:3-17)

James' primary point in the closing section of his letter:

Spiritual maturity happens in biblical community.

We simply cannot grow up in Christ, unless we grow together. (cf. Ephesians 4:1-16)

FOUR ESSENTIALS OF BIBLICAL COMMUNITY

1. Integrity: Community begins with trust. (5:12)

When it comes to community, trust means everything.

When we pretend, we lack integrity, and without integrity, there is no basis for community.

Biblical community is destroyed by spiritual hypocrisy, when our true self is very different from our public self.

2. Prayer: Community thrives on humility. (5:13-15)

The most telling sign of pride in the Christian's life is a lack of prayer.

"Is anyone among you suffering?"

"Is anyone cheerful?"

"Is any among you sick?"

"IF he has sinned, he will be forgiven?"

Prayer for Healing

"pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord...the prayer of faith"

The "prayer <u>of faith"</u> while "anointing <u>in the name of the Lord</u>" means praying for God's <u>will</u> (not our will), based on God's <u>promises</u> (not our merit), for the sake of God's <u>name</u> (not our reputation), so that God's answer <u>reveals</u> God's glory, and he <u>receives</u> glory through worship from those who witness what he's done.

"the prayer of faith will save (deliver) the one who is sick and the Lord will lift him up"

To be saved or delivered, in this context, does not necessarily mean to be saved from hell, or even a guarantee of physical healing in this life. God promises that every Christian will be healed physically, in the ultimate sense, in the <u>resurrection</u>. The primary point James is making here is, in the threat of a serious illness, the believer will be delivered from spiritual <u>defeat</u> and <u>immaturity</u>. (James 1:2-4; 2 Corinthians 12:3-10)

3. Confession: Community health requires transparency. (5:16-18)

I should confess my sin to those who have been affected by my sin.

A good rule of thumb is: Let your repentance be as <u>widely known</u> as your sin. When it comes to sin like gossip, confession may need to be extensive.

Acknowledging a sin to a trusted brother or sister in Christ can be a very important step in overcoming a sin.

"the prayer of a righteous person has great power"

"he prayed fervently" (lit. he prayed to pray – This was James' way of expressing the Hebrew idiom in **1 Kings 18:42** where Elijah "put his head between his knees" as he cried out to God to restore the rains after defeating the prophets of Baal on Mt Carmel)

4. Accountability: Community cares enough to intervene. (5:19-20)

Wise, caring intervention is an integral part of love.
