Weekend Message Questions Jesus-Centered - Jesus is Who We Proclaim October 25-26, 2025

CHECK-IN: Check with the members of your group to see how they are doing and follow up from your conversation from the previous session.

DISCUSS:

• What are some of the "storms" you have been through in your life? What did you think, feel, or do while in the storm? How did the storm impact your life going forward?

READ: Mark 6:47-52

- What stands out to you in this passage?
- How would you have reacted in this situation?
- "The storm wasn't the problem. Their hearts were. They didn't understand who Jesus really was." Looking back through the storms in your life, has this statement been true for you at some point? How?

In the midst of the storm, we need to **TRUST** Jesus. Using the questions below, take a moment to reflect and share about a current storm you may be facing or a past storm in your life.

How can you trust Him more fully in the storm?

T - Take Inventory: Mark 6:45-46

- Am I where God told me to be?
- Am I doing what He told me to do?
- Am I headed where He's leading me?

R- Remember Who You Serve: Mark 6:51-52

- Do I know who I serve?
- Do I believe He is who He says he is?
- Is my fear, anxiety, grief, etc. bigger than the one I serve?

U - Understand Your Limits: Mark 6:48

- Can I be confident in Jesus while in the chaos of this storm?
- Can I find peace in Him, even when I have questions that don't seem to be answered?
- Can I surrender control and trust Him fully?

S - Stand On His Word: Mark 6:50

"Take courage. Do not be afraid." This is not a pep talk, it's a command.

• Am I following the instructions/commands Jesus has given me?

T - Turn Your Eyes to Jesus: Matthew 14:28

- Am I willing to step out of the boat and rise above the chaos of the storm?
- Can I stay focused on Jesus through the distractions that may lure me away?

How can you be praying for everyone in your group this week?
