Weekend Message Questions The Pursuit of Wisdom Week 2: Wisdom of People 6/12 - 6/13

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CHECK-IN: Check with your group to see how they're doing.

BIG IDEA: We seek wisdom so that we can love other people well, which is the goal as we move to the center of God's purpose for our lives.

DISCUSS:

- How do you identify wisdom in others?
- Who is someone you consider to have wisdom? What about them makes them wise?
- Wisdom is knowledge applied. When it comes to loving others well, what knowledge do you have that can be difficult to apply in certain situations or with certain people?

READ: Proverbs 9:8-9, Proverbs 10:17 Proverbs 12:1, Proverbs 29:1

DISCUSS:

- Why is it difficult for people to accept critical feedback and discipline?
- We grow in wisdom by accepting correction and seeking guidance. How can you make this a more natural part of your life?

READ: Proverbs 15:22, Proverbs 27:9, Proverbs 27:17

DISCUSS:

- We can't be better without the input and accountability that comes from others.
- Who are the people in your life that represent the friends indicated in these verses?
- How do you intentionally help one another grow, or how can you start intentionally helping eachother grow?

CLOSE:

- 1. You are not broken if you have faults. You're one of us, the people who need JESUS.
 - Are you in a healthy place (mentally, spiritually, emotionally) that will enable you to grow in wisdom?
- 2. Our goal is to honor God by treating others with love, kindness, forgiveness, gentleness and peace.
 - Is this your goal for growing in wisdom everyday? How can you grow in these areas?
- 3. We gain wisdom by being an open book and knowing we need others on this path of growth.
 - Who do you have in your life that you trust and will allow to speak honestly into your life?
- 4. Wisdom seeks input from others for the sake of others.
 - When was the last time you asked for help, input, or feedback? How can you make this a part of your life, in order to love others better?
