

Weekend Message Questions
All For Jesus, Week 3: Jesus Serves

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CHECK-IN:

- What is one habit or routine in your daily life that requires intentional discipline to build?
- When you hear the word "greatness," what qualities or images usually come to mind?

READ: [Matthew 20:25-28](#)

DISCUSS:

- Jesus turns the world's idea of power and status upside down by defining greatness as being a servant. Why do you think our natural, human desire craves position, control, or recognition instead?
- How can viewing service as a spiritual discipline—where failure is accounted for as we train our hearts—change the way we approach serving others?

READ: [Luke 23:34](#)

DISCUSS:

- Jesus demonstrated radical love and service even while on the cross by forgiving those who harmed Him. What does it cost us to extend that same kind of grace and service to people who are difficult to love?
- Serving like Jesus requires us to reject power, reject pride, and embrace love. What does living out a "bold humility" look like in your workplace, family, or community?

READ: [Philippians 4:10-13](#)

DISCUSS:

- Philippians 4:13 is often taken out of context to mean "I can achieve any goal I want". How does knowing Paul wrote this while enduring extreme trials change your understanding of Christ's strength in our lives?
- What is the difference between doing things FOR Jesus to prove our worth versus serving WITH Jesus as a response to what He has already done?

READ: [Philippians 4:13](#)

DISCUSS:

- Self-righteous service tends to be visible, self-serving, and effort-driven, while Jesus-centered service is humble, hidden, and led by Him. Which of these two tendencies do you struggle with most?
- As our church prepares for change, how can focusing on being near to Jesus transform the way we use our gifts to serve inside and outside the church?

APPLY: How can the message be applied?

- Identify one act of service you can do this week that is intentionally hidden or unrecognized, focusing on doing it *with* Jesus rather than for approval or status.

PRAYER TIME: Share prayer requests related to the heart, healing, spiritual growth, or personal circumstances.

- Pray for transformed hearts that reject pride and performance, asking Jesus to give us strength to serve alongside Him in genuine humility and love.
