### REFLECT

- 1. What do different churches pursue as their primary mission? For example, some churches pursue political action as their primary mission.
- 2. How did this week's sermon challenge your idea of the mission of the church?

#### **ENCOUNTER**

The apostle Paul once stated the heart of his mission like this: to present everyone mature or complete in Christ. "We proclaim him, warning and teaching everyone with all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ. I labor for this, striving with his strength that works powerfully in me" (Colossians 1:28-29).

The most famous and most important statement of the mission of the church is Matthew 28:18-20. The resurrected Jesus Christ gathered his disciples to give them his mission and the strength to fulfill it. Read Jesus' Great Commission for his disciples in Matthew 28:18-20, and if you know the passage well, don't let familiarity dull you to the awesome task.

- 4. In your own words, what is a disciple?
- 5. Jesus uses three words to explain how we make disciples: go, baptize, and teach. Discuss the significance of each word.
