ENCOUNTER

Believers in Jesus Christ are a new creation. The old self is gone and the new self is put on. Because we are a new creation, believers can be commanded to put to death their old ways and now clothe themselves in righteousness. Paul explains what that means for our relationships in Ephesians 4:25-32. He gives a set of five commands that include a positive, a negative, and a reason. Paul both commands what the new life ought to look like and then fuels it with gospel truths. Study Ephesians 4:25-32 together answering three questions for each set of commands..

- 3. What is the negative command? Give an example of how this sin shows up in our lives each week..
- 4. What is the positive command? How does this relate to the negative command?
- 5. What is the basis or reason for the command?

- 7. Conviction should be followed by confession and obedience fueled by the gospel. What steps of obedience can you take tomorrow to live as a new creation? What gospel truth from Ephesians 4 can fuel that promise?
