SERMON STUDY

REFLECT

- 1. Why do people want to get married?
- 2. If you are married, why do you want to get married?

ENCOUNTER

Paul's culminating description of marriage in Ephesians 5 is that marriage is a "mystery." When we hear "mystery," we think of something confusing or mysterious. While marriage can be both confusing and mysterious, that's not what a biblical mystery is. When Paul describes marriage as a "mystery" what he means is that marriage is a picture to help us understand Jesus and the church. In the mind of God, he designed marriage to be a parable, a picture, a shadow of the great reality of Jesus Christ. Marriage is patterned after Christ and his church. Therefore purpose of marriage is that people would look *through* us *to* Jesus Christ. Go back and read Ephesians 5:30-32 and meditate on the purpose of marriage.

- 3. How is this understanding of the purpose of marriage different than the world's (and many Christians') purposes for marriage?
- 4. How can marriage display God to the surrounding world?
- 5. How can understanding the purpose of marriage challenge in the midst of difficulties?

- 7. How can a difficult marriage still show the world Christ?
