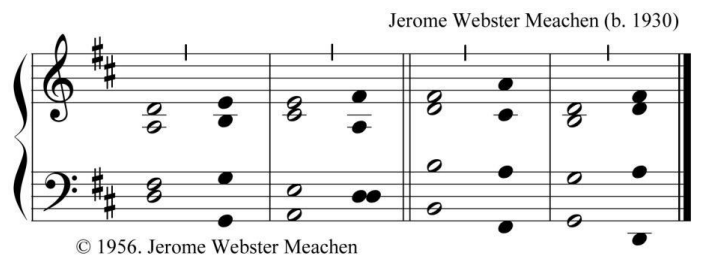
The First Lesson: Genesis 32:3-8, 22-30

3 And Jacob sent messengers before him to Esau his
brother in the land of Seir, the country of Edom, 4
instructing them, "Thus you shall say to my lord Esau:
Thus says your servant Jacob, 'I have sojourned with
Laban and stayed until now. 5 I have oxen, donkeys,
flocks, male servants, and female servants. I have sent
to tell my lord, in order that I may find favor in your
sight.'" 6 And the messengers returned to Jacob,
saying, "We came to your brother Esau, and he is
coming to meet you, and there are four hundred men
with him." 7 Then Jacob was greatly afraid and
distressed. He divided the people who were with him,

14 But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it 15 and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. 16 All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, 17 that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.

The Sermon

Deacon or Priest: Let us confess our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed.

All: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, visible and invisible.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. *Amen.*

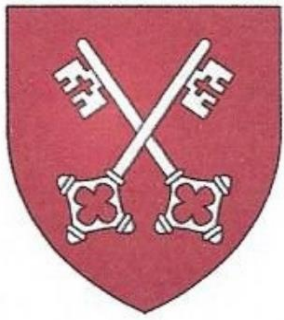
Job Opportunity at St. Peter's: Office Administrator
