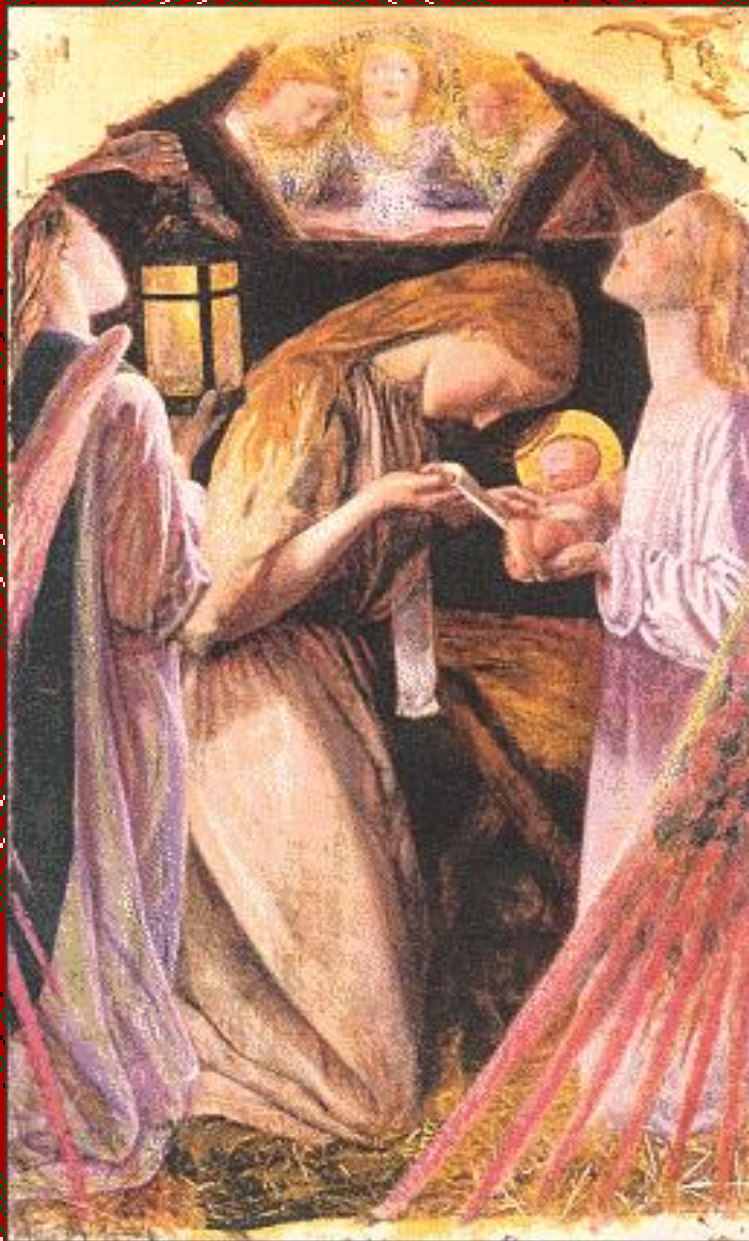

## ST. LUCY FEAST DAY DECEMBER 13<sup>th</sup>



Saint Lucy was a Christian martyr who was reared in the city of Syracuse, Sicily, in a wealthy yet pious family. Following the death of her father her mother arranged for the marriage of Saint Lucy to a pagan nobleman even though she protested the arrangement. She prayed to Saint Agatha to have her mother change her mind, and requested that the dowry given to the poor. When her mother was cured of a long-term illness, she canceled the marriage. However, the bride groom who was rejected reported Saint Lucy to the pagan authorities because she had devoted her life to Christ. Following this she was tortured, burned, and finally killed by having a sword or dagger thrust through her throat.

The name Lucy means "light" and is why Saint Lucy is the patron for eye ailments. She is also the patron for authors, epidemics, salesmen, peasants, throat infections, dysentery, and martyrs. Saint Lucy is often pictured in paintings holding a dish with eyes. Saint Lucy's feast day is celebrated on December 13<sup>th</sup>. Her Prayer is:

***Relying on Your Goodness, O God, we humbly ask you, in the intercession of your servant, Saint Lucy, to give perfect vision to our eyes, that we may serve for your greater honor and glory. Saint Lucy, hear our prayers and obtain our petitions. Amen.***

# HAVE YOURSELF A SACRAMENTAL THANKSGIVING: A Thanksgiving Sermon



Is blessing ever good for us? Our Thanksgiving Day reading from Deuteronomy 8 spells out the big problem with receiving blessings: that God's blessings can ironically become the worst thing to ever happen to us as God's people, since blessing can cause us to forget about God. Blessing can breed self-sufficiency, blessing can create the illusion of independence, the notion that we don't really need God to sustain us and uphold us every moment of every day. So our Old Testament lesson warns us: "Take care lest you forget the Lord your God by not keeping his commandments and his rules and his statutes, which I command you today, lest, when you have eaten and are full and have built good houses and live in them, and when your herds and flocks multiply and your silver and gold is multiplied and all that you have is multiplied, then your heart be lifted up, and you forget the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, who led you through the great and terrifying wilderness, with its fiery serpents and scorpions and thirsty ground where there was no water, who brought you water out of the flinty rock, who fed you in the wilderness with manna that your fathers did not know, that he might humble you and test you, to do you good in the end. Beware lest you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gotten me this wealth.'" So, I ask again, is blessing ever really good for us?

Something else is clear from our Old Testament lesson: the significant role of remembrance in receiving God's blessing correctly. "You shall remember the Lord your God." Remember that it is he, not ourselves who gives us all good things. But is it enough just to say that we should try to remember? I forget things that I want to remember all of the time, so why not forget God too? I think the answer to receiving God's blessing without letting God's blessing become a way to forget God is found in the Eucharist.

You have no doubt heard me say before that the Greek word "Eucharist" means "Thanksgiving." Thanksgiving is my favorite holiday, and one reason why is that, intentionally or not, of all the holidays it is the truest presentation of Christian life and Christian celebration. The whole Christian life is supposed to be Eucharistic, a life of Thanksgiving to God for everything that God has already for us in Jesus Christ. For life to be Eucharistic does not mean that we are constantly generating an "attitude of gratitude" for having the niceties of life, but that we are always looking through every experience in our life to see Jesus Christ. We look through everything to see Jesus Christ. And this is why the Eucharist is truly how we receive God's blessings without allowing God's blessings to become the way that we forget God.

The Eucharist itself is a Sacrament, and the classic definition of a Sacrament is that of an inward, intangible grace taking an outward, tangible form. So, to view our blessings Sacramentally means that we do not receive them as an end in themselves, but we receive them as something pointing to Jesus Christ. To live Eucharistically means having eyes to see Jesus Christ in and through our blessings, to view the gifts of life as a Sacrament.

What does this mean for us, practically speaking, as we celebrate the Thanksgiving holiday together? It means that as we gather together for a great feast, we do not view the feast as an end in itself, but as a foretaste of the great feast to come in the marriage supper of the Lamb. It means that as we gather with loved ones who are with us, and lament the loss of loved ones who are not with us, we see our perfect and imperfect love bearing witness to the love of God in the Trinity, and in the fellowship of the Saints. It means that as we take time to count our blessings, we do far more than count our blessings, because counting our blessings is not enough, and it isn't really all that Christian. We do not count our blessings, as if they are an end in themselves to be acquired, we look through our blessings to the God who has done everything for us in Jesus Christ. Remember the Lord your God. Amen.

## RESCUE MISSION DONATION BOX

Placed right next to the Zeteo Missions donation box in the church is a box for the Denver Rescue Mission Harvest Farm at Wellington. The Denver Rescue Mission is a non-denominational Christian organization with a branch operation in Fort Collins. They are committed to following essential truths of Biblical Christianity. Their New Life Program is a one-year, immersive, foundation-building, life-changing program for men at the Harvest Farm. While in the program, some participants even go on to higher education. Some qualifying participants also receive a vehicle when they finish the New Life Program.

St Peter's parishioner Seth Forwood is the director for the Fort Collins branch of the Rescue Mission, and he suggests that these types of donations are most helpful: winter coats, trousers, shirts, winter hats and more. Also, check the list posted on the bulletin board near the box for donation needs for the male participants. Used items are okay, new ones are best! Also, please check the list to see what types of items are not acceptable. Blessings, and thank you!

Kate is teaching some of the classes as are Zeteo’s two certified teachers, Christian and Alicia. There has already been one trip with the kids to Manila where they met other home school kids. For kids who have spent their entire lives at the mission, this was quite a trip.

Our four Christmas boxes shipped in September have arrived at Zeteo. This is wonderful news as the boxes did not make it in time for Christmas last year!

**1st CANDLE** – (purple) **THE PROPHECY CANDLE or CANDLE OF HOPE** – We can have hope because God is faithful and will keep the promises made to us. Our hope comes from God. (Romans 15:12-13)

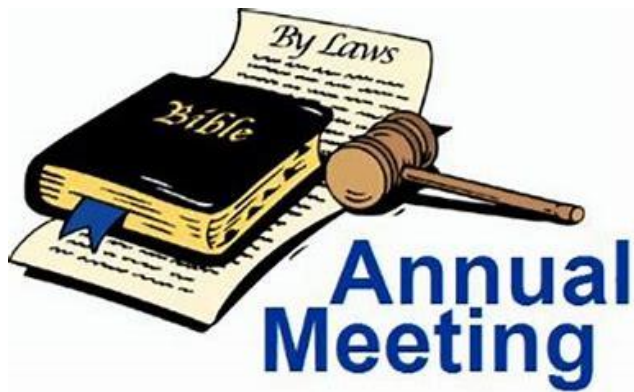
**2nd CANDLE** – (purple) **THE BETHLEHEM CANDLE or THE CANDLE OF PREPARATION** – God kept his promise of a Savior who would be born in Bethlehem. Preparation means to “get ready”. Help us to be ready to welcome YOU, O GOD! (Luke 3:4-6)

**3rd CANDLE** – (pink) **THE SHEPHERD CANDLE or THE CANDLE OF JOY** – The angels sang a message of JOY! (Luke 2:7-15)

**4th CANDLE** – (purple) **THE ANGEL CANDLE or THE CANDLE OF LOVE** – The angles announced the good news of a Savior. God sent his only Son to earth to save us, because he loves us! (John 3:16-17)

**5th CANDLE** – (white) **“CHRIST CANDLE”** – The white candle reminds us that Jesus is the spotless lamb of God, sent to wash away our sins! His birth was for his death, his death was for our birth! (John 1:29)
