## THE DISRUPTIVE KING: MATTHEW 10:34-37



*"Before the royal presence of this man, there was no neutrality."* Thomas Torrance

"Do not think that I have come to bring peace to the earth. I have not come to bring peace, but a sword...Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me. And whoever does not take his cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." These difficult words come to us from a portion of Matthew's Gospel commonly referred to as Jesus' sending sermon, as Jesus

sends Apostles as his representatives into the world in order to heal, teach, and proclaim the coming Kingdom of God.

The Kingdom of God is a Kingdom of Grace with Jesus at its center as King, and the gracious kingship of Jesus is always disruptive. Is Jesus a violent person? Hardly, it seems he did not even own a sword. But Jesus' presence will disrupt what we consider "normal," since our understanding of normal life is what makes God's crucifixion necessary in the first place, so we will react to the peace of Jesus with our violence.

Does Jesus have something against families? It depends. The use of familial language like "brother" and "sister," "Father," or "Mother" in the Church is not flowery religious language, it is the language of the new family of God. The new family of God exists because the most important relationships are disrupted by Jesus of Nazareth. The only blood ties that bind together the family of God is the blood of the Crucified Lamb shared at our family table in the Eucharist. Life in the Kingdom of God requires viewing all human relationships, especially the most important human relationships, as secondary to Jesus. This commitment to God's family over-and-against biological family was one reason why the Focus on the Family Roman Empire felt it necessary to kill Christians.

The issue at the heart of this challenging reading from the Gospel of Matthew is the primacy of God, the primacy of Jesus. Jesus is not telling us that family is bad, or that we are required to be in conflict with family in order to share in life with him. Likewise, Jesus is not telling us that the normal parts of life in an earthly kingdom are necessarily bad, but that they must always bend the knee to Jesus, not the other way around. Or as Karl Barth said, to say "God and...is to open the door to every demon." We are never confronted with decisions like "Jesus vs. obvious evil," but "Jesus vs. good things demanding allegiance that only belongs to Jesus."

When we give allegiance to good things that are not Jesus, or when we share allegiance to Jesus with good things that are not Jesus, two things happen. Those good things become evil, and since God is a God who does not compromise with evil, those good things must be destroyed. What does it mean to take up our cross and follow Jesus today? It means that when we are presented with any opportunity to give allegiance that belongs only to God to anything else, we take up our cross and follow Jesus, to the exclusion of all that we consider natural.



## SAINT DAVID of SWEDEN FEAST DAY IS CELEBRATED JULY 15th



Saint David of Sweden, also known as Saint David of Munkthorp, was an Anglo-Saxon Cluniac monk from the 11<sup>th</sup> Century. Becoming interested in the Scandinavian apostolate following the example set by Bishop Sigfrid of Vaxio, Sweden, he traveled to Vastman-land along with Saint Sigfrid and Saint Botvid. He preached chiefly in <u>Södermanland</u> and Västmanland, and in the area of Lake Mälaren where he built a monastery in Munkthorp. It was said that he literally wandered among small villages and towns, preaching God's word. He baptized the converted, held nightly prayer vigils, committing to God his plentiful converts.

He has been described as a long and hard-working clergyman. In his missionary endeavors, where he had hoped for martyrdom, Saint David died peacefully in old age in 1082. Following his death, he was buried at Munktorps kyrka where miracles were reported at his tomb. His feast day is celebrated on July 15<sup>th</sup>.

## SAINT OSWALD of NORTHUMBRIA FEAST DAY IS CELEBRATED AUGUST 5th




Saint Oswald of Northumbria became a Christian after fleeing to Scotland. known as the first of the English royal saints, and prior to defeating the pagan King Caedwalla in a battle at Heavenfield in AD635, he fashioned a cross and implored his troops to kneel and pray for a victory. Years after his death, it was at this spot, where a church was constructed, that monks continued to pray for his soul.

One of his first acts on becoming the new king was to ask for a bishop from the Island of Iona. Saint Aidan responded, and for his services he was awarded with the Island of Lindisfarne. Saint Aidan reported that Saint Oswald listened humbly and readily to his advice and counsel. Although Saint Oswald gave lands and money for the building of monasteries and churches, he also was a competent administrator and leader. He brought together Bernicia and Deira to create Northumbrian. After seven years of reign Saint Oswald was killed at the Battle of Maserfeld by the pagan King Mercia. His last prayer to those around him was: "O God, be merciful to their souls."

A miracle attributed to Saint Oswald in AD681 tells of a small boy at the Selsey monastery who had a vision of Saint Peter. Selsey was in the middle of an

epidemic and hundreds were dying of the plague. Saint Peter told the boy that the epidemic would soon end, thanks to the intervention of Saint Oswald. The vision day was on the anniversary of Saint Oswald's death, and the vision came true.

Saint Oswald's Feast Day is celebrated on August 5<sup>th</sup>, although some records show August 4<sup>th</sup> and others August 9<sup>th</sup>. Saint Oswald's flag is described by The Venerable Bede from his eighth century writings as being gold and purple. It is possible that the purple in the flag faded over the years so that the maroon or carmine red color became the prominent feature.

## SEPTEMBER PARISH INSTRUCTION

#### September 17 - Instructed Eucharist and Building Committee Update

During the 9:30 Eucharist, Fr. Matt will lead an Instructed Eucharist, a service which walks through why we worship the way that we worship as Anglicans in the context of the Eucharist. Those who wish not to attend the Instructed Eucharist because of its length are welcome to attend the 8 am service, which will continue as normal. The building committee will have a brief update on recent progress following the Instructed Eucharist.

#### September 24 - Adult and Children's Education Begin

Adult Education: Seth Forwood will begin a four-to-five-week class on "Poetry and the Psalms."

**Newcomer Catechism:** Fr. Matt will begin a catechism class for any newcomers who are interested in being confirmed or received into the life of St. Peter's.

**Children's Education:** Children will continue to learn and grow with the "God's Big Story" curriculum, with art, and with Taizé songs.

#### Newcomer Class in the Fall:

Father Matt will teach a class for any newcomers who are interested in membership at St. Peter's following the 9:30 Eucharist, beginning in September. Specific dates are forthcoming.



## ACNA ATTENDANCE REBOUNDS



Anglican congregations in the United States, Canada and Mexico are reporting a significant attendance increase of 17,228 persons following a widespread return to regular worship services post-COVID. The Anglican Church in North America (ACNA) is also reporting modest growth in both membership and total number of churches in 2022.

Overall Average Principal Service Attendance in 2022 was 75,583, up 30 percent from 58,255 in 2021. Membership increased 2,549 (up 2 percent from 122,450) in 2021 to 124,999 in 2022. Congregations grew by three to 977 total.

Membership and attendance are among several metrics tracked year-over-year by ACNA. Baptisms were up 27 percent and confirmations up 25 percent from 2021-2022. Receptions from other liturgical denominations were down 8 percent, while reaffirmations were up 46 percent.

"The bottom line in 2022 is that membership and the total number of our congregations showed modest increases, while attendance has rebounded encouragingly and pastoral ministry has bounced back significantly," ACNA Canon for Communications Andrew Gross told ACNA Provincial Council on Friday, June 23 at Christ Church Cathedral in Plano, Texas. Gross noted that attendance remained down from a pre-COVID high of 84,310 in 2018. Gross shared that the largest number of ACNA congregations are in the state of Texas (113), followed by South Carolina (101), California (73), Pennsylvania (55) and Virginia (51). North Dakota remains the only U.S. state without an ACNA congregation.

Note: St. Peter's Anglican Church attendance did not suffer during the Covid-19 pandemic as the parish continued to meet outside on the church lawn. Church total Sunday attendance in 2020 was 4,750 and in 2021 it was 4,812. The Sunday average attendance was 91.3 parishioners in 2020, and 92.5 parishioners in 2021. In 2022 the total was 5,256 Sunday attendees with an average of 101 parishioners per Sunday. 2023 attendance is running well ahead of 2022, and a June record, as the average Sunday attendance for June was 128. Projecting this to the end of the year, the total Sunday attendance for 2023 should well surpass the 6,000 level.

Dr. Megan Roberts, The now Reverend Doctor Roberts, was ordained an Anglican Deacon on Wednesday, June 21<sup>st</sup>, at the cathedral in Calagary, Canada. She began her pursuit of becoming a deacon while at Saint Peter's. She is currently serving as the Program Director and Professor of Old Testament Studies with the Bible/Theology Program at Prairie College in Three Hills, Alberta, Canada.

## THE PELICAN AS A SYMBOL OF CHRIST



Over the centuries many Christians believed that the bird known as the pelican symbolized charity and virtue to remind us of Jesus' giving of His life on the cross for our redemption. This symbolism comes perhaps from a story of a mother pelican who was starving. Seen as an image of Jesus' suffering and death to gain eternal life, this mother stabbed her own breast with her bill, and used her own blood to feed her starving young.

The Bible contains five verses mentioning

pelicans. The Book of Deuteronomy indicates that the Israelites were taught that the pelican was an unclean bird – meaning it was not to be eaten.

Throughout history pelicans have been known as social birds demonstrating responsibility to others in the flock, showing loyalty, serving as team members as they fish together, having a great capacity for endurance through their long migratory flights, and demonstrating friendliness among their members that provides healing and renewal.

The Lord has blessed us in northern Colorado with flocks of summer white pelicans to soar with their black tipped wings in the blue sky, dot our many lakes and reservoirs with their white feathered bodies, and to show us in early spring – sometimes late winter – that summer is something that is truly on the way again.


