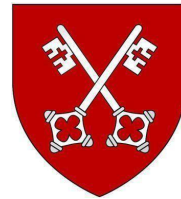


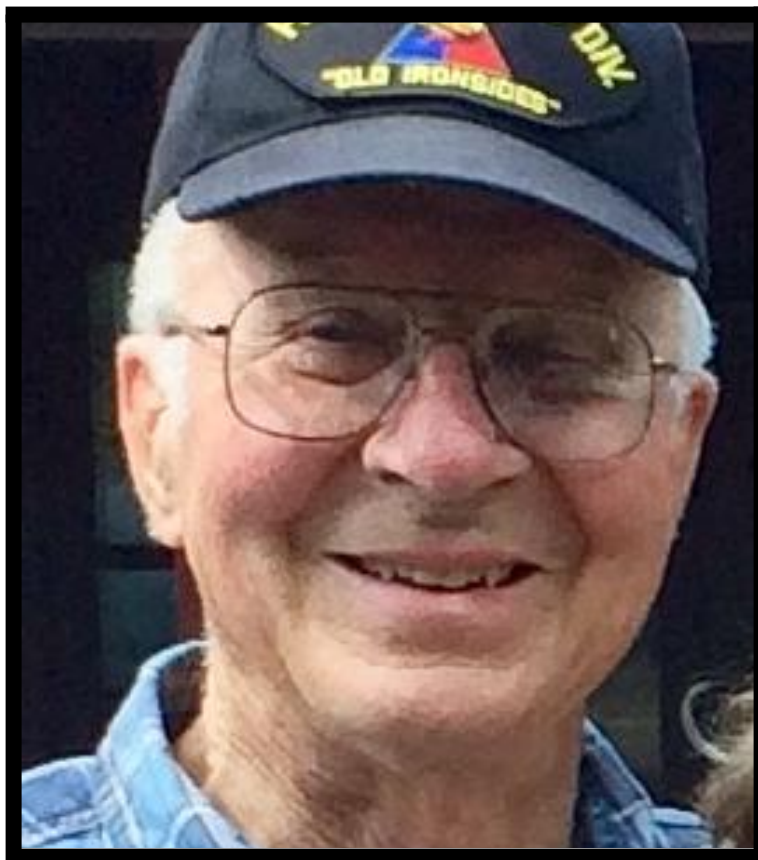

By the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary he became flesh and dwelt among us. In obedience to your will, he stretched out his arms upon the Cross and offered himself once for all, that by his suffering and death we might be saved. By his resurrection he broke the bonds of death, trampling Hell and Satan under his feet. As our great high priest, he ascended to your right hand in glory, that we might come with confidence before the throne of grace.

On the night that he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat; this is my Body, which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me."

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. ***Amen.***

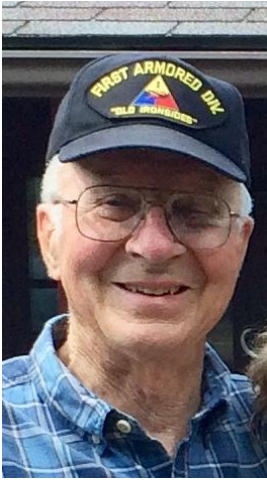

Rex Kellums' Obituary



Rex Eugene Kellums, a beloved, loving Christian husband, devoted and caring father and grandfather joined his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ on Tuesday, April 7, 2026.

Rex was born to Wesley E. Kellums and Neva G. Mills Kellums 87 years ago in Scottsbluff NE. Rex grew up as a farm boy in eastern WY and western NE. He graduated from Lyman NE

high school in 1956 and from Colorado State University, Ft. Collins, with a BS in Ag. Business, 1970, and also earned his Masters in Ed in 1971 from CSU. Having been in Army ROTC at CSU, Rex served his country as an infantry officer (First Lt.) in the First Armored Division and was last at Ft. Hood TX, where he met on "May Day", May 1, 1963, on a blind date, his future wife Margaret Scott (then a college senior near graduation). As long as he was able, Rex gave Margaret a "May basket" of flowers on May Day! Rex and Margaret were married June 27, 1964 at St. George's Church, Texas City TX. Immediately after marriage, they moved to Ft. Collins where Rex in 1965 began his 30 year career at CSU and where Rex and Margaret have lived all their married life. At Colorado State University, Rex served as Ass't. Director of Housing, Director of Student Orientation and Assistant Dean, Interim V.P. for Student Affairs, Assistant V.P. for Student Affairs, retiring at age 57 in 1995. For the next 4 years, Rex was employed part time as a rep. for VALIC. Rex and Margaret were active at St. Luke's Church of Ft. Collins for 37 years before joining St. Andrew's Church. In 2007, Rex and Margaret became charter members, helping to found St. Peter's Anglican Church. With Margaret, Rex was an active member of Gideons International, since 1999, where they both served the Lord in jail ministry and Rex was Scripture Distribution Chair for the FCSouth Camp for many years. Rex served his church as Jr. Warden, Vestry member, on several committees, usher, lay reader, church retreats, a graduate of 4 year EFM, Cursillo

and active participant of many Bible studies. Rex's community interests included Elks, Optimists, United Way, Boy Scouts, CSU Alumni Board, credit union board, health clubs, and several professional organizations. Rex was honored to receive the CSU Pennock Award. Before many health challenges, Rex was an avid hand and racquet ball player, fly fisherman, and enjoyed cross-country skiing, snow shoeing, mountain climbing and canoeing and more. In later years, Rex organized many golf outings and cribbage games with friends, was a regular at an every Wednesday morning breakfast group, Thursday morning Bible study-prayer group, Gideon's Saturday prayer-breakfasts and regular Bible distributions. Among Rex's blessings and greatest of pleasures was being with and traveling with Margaret, having family gatherings and being with his 3 granddaughters--getting to travel with them and Margaret overseas. In earlier years, he greatly enjoyed being up at "Dogpatch", a share-rented cabin in Red Feather, CO. Rex was a man of great faith, prayer and regular Bible devotions. He was a faithful Christian witness in all he did. He was very generous and willing to serve, touching many lives through his ministries. Humble in his ways, his infectious humor has left a lasting impression, having one-on-ones, visiting many people--as well as being known as sharing joy with his many comical stories and jokes. His view on life was optimistic and positive--especially throughout his many surgeries and health challenges. Rex will be greatly missed, but his legacy of faith in God, loyalty, joy and laughter lives on in the hearts of his family and many friends. Rex is survived by his loving wife Margaret, of 61 years, 3 devoted grown children, Steve Kellums (Cindy), her daughter Cassandra (her fiancé Tanner), Laura Kellums Walker (Nelson), and Joel Kellums (Elizabeth), former daughter-in-law Kris and 3 adoring granddaughters: Megan Kellums (Steven Rouk), Ashley Kellums and Rebekah Kellums, his sister Neva Ann Schmechel (John) and numerous nieces and nephews, our good family friend, Robert Serunjogi. Rex's parents and sister Fay Kellums Kautz proceed him in death.
