



THE GIFT OF THANKSGIVING



The St. Peter's Icon: A Gift of Thanksgiving for the Faithful Service of Many to St. Peter's Church. One of the most attractive and noble features of St. Peter's that I noticed when I was called to become your Rector was the great endurance that many members of this church have shown through years of hardship and difficulties. I recognize that the stability and positive direction of this church is not of my own making. So, it has been my desire to honor that faithful history in an appropriate way.

Having a long-standing relationship with Bishop Trevor Walters, who is also a friend of St. Peter's, I knew that his wife DeDe Johnson is an incredibly gifted artist who has produced icons for my previous parish in Phoenix. I asked DeDe to pray about making an icon for St. Peter's, and if she felt that it was indeed a fitting gift for the Church, and she agreed that it was. With that being said, to the glory of God in thanksgiving for years of faithfulness through difficult times, we have

been blessed with a sacred icon of our namesake Apostle, Saint Peter.

What are Icons For?

This leaves us with a question that may be awkward for some: what are we supposed to do with icons? St. Gregory of Nyssa, Bishop and Father of the early Church, was known to weep uncontrollably whenever he passed an icon depicting Abraham's sacrifice of Isaac in Genesis 22. Bishop Gregory felt that as he gazed upon that gruesome and gracious scene so movingly painted, he was transported to the very foot of the Cross of Christ, as if he was gazing through a window in time at the timeless Lord of eternity. For the majority of Christians throughout history, icons have served precisely this function: they are windows into the very grace of God, which grant us access to the presence of Christ himself.

At the same time, we must also acknowledge the controversies that surround icons and the abuse of icons, and what that means for us as Anglican Christians today. If it feels like most Christians, at least most Protestants, that we interact with are opposed to icons there is a good reason for that. The heritage of most American Protestants comes from what Church Historians refer to as the "Radical Reformation," a segment of the 16th century Reformations which includes Baptists, Quakers, Brethren Churches, and so on. These are the traditions who found an opportunity in a new world without old-world restrictions most attractive, and brought their revulsion for iconography with them. "Iconoclasm," or the view that icons must either be rejected or even destroyed, was taught most explicitly among those church traditions who came to inhabit America and build churches here.

While Iconoclasm may feel like a majority view among Christians, that is far from true globally and historically. Historic Christianity has always utilized beautiful depictions of witnesses throughout the history of Scripture and the Church to bring God's people into the presence of God. The primary biblical justification for this practice can be found in passages such Colossians 1:15, when Christ is called "the image (literally the 'icon') of the invisible God."

Like every gift given to the Church to aid her in worship throughout history, icons have been abused. The 22nd Article of the *39 Articles of Religion*, the doctrinal foundation for Anglicanism, speaks against "Romish Doctrine concerning Purgatory, Pardons, Worshipping, and Adoration, as well of Images as of *Reliques*, and also invocation of Saints." While on the surface this article would suggest iconography has no place within Anglican Christianity, what is rejected by this article are the "Romish" abuses of medieval Catholicism, when icons were treated as objects of worship themselves, were connected with fund-raising, and treated as a matter of salvation. Even the Roman Catholic Church banned medieval Catholic worship of icons at the Council of Trent, held shortly after the Reformations in Europe, as Roman Catholicism also recognized the need to correct abuses surrounding icons.

To summarize, the purpose of an icon is not that it becomes an object of worship itself, but that it functions like a window into the sacred and holy. As we gaze at our own icon of St. Peter in our sanctuary, we see a complicated man who consistently got in the way of Jesus' plans, who rejected Jesus publicly, yet whose confession of Jesus as the Christ became the very foundation for the Church built upon our rejection of Jesus. The halo that surrounds his head signifies that St. Peter, like us, is a recipient of the grace of God that makes sinful humanity holy. Elsewhere in the New Testament, St. Paul encourages Christians by saying, "imitate me as I imitate Christ." Imitate St. Peter as he imitates Christ. Imitate him, as he lays down his life for the Church and for a world which hates him. Be strengthened for such imitation by gazing into the very presence of Jesus Christ, who is the icon of the invisible God, and do by gazing upon the witness of St. Peter.

For those who would like additional assistance in using icons for deepening their life with God, I would encourage you to read Henri Nouwen's *Behold, the Beauty of the Lord*, which details his own journey with God through art and iconography.



ST BRENDAN the NAVIGATOR



Born in Kerry County, Ireland, in 484; Saint Brendan became a priest in 577. In his early years he traveled around the country of Ireland building monastic cells, including those at Ardfert and Shanakeel. He is considered one of the Twelve Apostles of Ireland, and his feast day is yearly celebrated on May 16th.

Saint Brendan is known for his voyage of seven years in search of Paradise (The Garden of Eden). Many stories exist describing his voyage on the Atlantic Ocean with somewhere between 14 and 60 pilgrims. It is said that he encountered a sea monster, and discovered Saint Brendan's Island which was covered with green vegetation. To some today it is thought that he actually landed at Greenland, while others believe that he sailed to North America. Christopher Columbus wrote on the eve of his voyage in 1492: "I am convinced that the terrestrial paradise is in the Island of Saint Brendan, which none can reach save by the Will of God".

Today Saint Brendan the Navigator (also known as the Voyager and the Bold) is considered the patron saint for mariners, sailors, travelers, and whales. At the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland; a large stained-glass window depicts Saint Brendan's maritime achievements as a sailor. In 1976 Irish explorer Tim Severin constructed an ox-leather boat thought to be similar to Saint Brendan's boat. Over the course of two summers, he sailed it from Ireland to the Hebrides, Faroe Islands, Iceland and finally to Newfoundland demonstrating that Saint Brendan's voyage was actually feasible.

CELEBRATING EASTER with ZETEO



Zeteo is still under Covid quarantine, but in Kate's words, "things are getting better", especially traveling to town, between provinces, etc. There are now four employees that are able to commute to work, but everyone else is still living at the mission, quarantined. The mask mandate is also still in effect.

The biggest news is that Kate has a new accreditation list to comply with and it has somewhere near 290 new mandatory items on it. Some requirements may be necessary and realistic, but others don't appear to be. An example is a new requirement for a computer lab for 1-3-year-olds to do research while the local State School where you can get an IT degree doesn't even have a computer lab. There is a new toothpaste requirement for the children and toothpaste must be measured in milliliters. These requirements are discouraging for Kate, but she is wading through them and looking for ways to meet them. There is a possibility that the focus of our monthly boxes may change with new needs that Kate may have. It will take some time to sort through all this on Kate's end, but if there are any changes, we will let you know right away. The new requirements are causing many foster care homes/children's homes to close resulting in many children needing placement. Kate has been told to be ready for an influx of new children.

Ezekiel is still waiting for his surgery. He has a chronic bladder infection and his "bacterial load" must come down before they can do surgery. He has now been moved into the hospital for IV antibiotics. One of the Zeteo caregivers, Catherine, has been with him continuously.

Jake, Kate's right hand man, had something fall on his head and suffered a concussion over 2 weeks ago. His recovery has been slow and he is very needed at Zeteo. He and Kate are the only people that can drive 4-wheeled vehicles and this has left Kate to do all the driving for supplies, medical appointments, etc. Jake has been with Kate and Zeteo for over 10 years. Please pray for all of the above issues.

We will be having a Zeteo update on May 15th right after church and can go into more detail on any of the above at that time. We will also be happy to answer any questions at that time, so please mark your calendars and join us then.

A LETTER from JOVIA at ZETEO



(This introduction letter is to the members of the St Peter's parish from Zeteo's pre-school teacher, Jovia. Thank you to Frannie A. for helping to edit it.)

I am Jovia May Parangat Maminta. I do believe that God's way is always perfect, even though life seems so hard. When I was a kid, I really dreamed of being a teacher, so I started a degree in teaching. It was challenging, and I didn't expect that I could still finish my degree because my parents were not financially stable with no house of our own to live in. My mom sold our property for her application abroad. She ended up not going. My mom's oldest sister lets us have a place to live. It was such a hard time for me and for my parents that I couldn't really finish my studies.

But God sent people to help me finish my degree despite all the people who are tearing us down. I used it as a motivation to really work so hard to finish my degree and by God's grace and favor He gave it to me unexpectedly this early 2022.

In this world's perception I am a licensed professional teacher, but the way God sees us isn't about the degree or titles that we have. Being in this mission really helps me to grow more in all the aspects of my life. I can say that I am a better version of myself now than I was before. I am joyful that God has given me this mission to bring me back to Him. I was at the lowest point of my faith in God. I remember my prayer, crying out to Him and did challenge God that "If you want me to get back in your ministry Lord, please give me this job" I have been a Christian since I was a kid, but I know I am still far from the reality that I grew up believing and this mission helps me so much to really see what are the facts about what it's like to really have a real relationship with Jesus and how to love and serve like Him. Now, by God's grace we do have our own house but not our own lot yet praying that someday we could buy that lot.

My mother has had polio since she was a little girl. She finished her elementary education degree but didn't pass the examination. She's been a food vendor since I was a kid and my father was a security guard back then and that's how they raised us financially. My brother hasn't finished his studies yet. He stopped and chose to work, but his salary was for his own expenses. I'm the only one supporting my family right now. I'm hoping so hard that my brother will change and help me support our parents. My father had a mild stroke last year, and one of my challenges is that there are times that he's still drinking alcohol and does smoke. Hoping that this covid will go away very soon so that I could be with my family physically to really help them on how to take good care of themselves. I'm so thankful that God has given me another family through this Mission. I am so blessed that I am here as being a missionary has never been easy. It is such a real pain. That wasn't my plan at first. I know I could have applied to a public school since I've got the license already. There are plenty of benefits.

It was me and God who really knew what was in my heart and I always pray that God will keep His identity in my life not looking at this world's standard. Even Though the situation does hurt. May He keep His promises inside my heart and let it grow in my everyday living.




A Mother's Prayer


