The goal of Fire Prevention Month (and week October 5th - 11th) is to raise fire safety awareness and help protect homes and families. In 1922, the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) named the second week of October Fire Prevention Week

in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire in 1871.

Did you know that if a fire starts in your home you may have as little as two minutes to escape? During a fire, early warning from a working smoke alarm plus a fire escape plan that has been practiced regularly can save lives. Learn what else to do to keep your loved ones safe! Top Tips for Fire Safety: 1) Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms, and outside sleeping areas. 2) Test smoke alarms every month. If they're not working, change the batteries. 3) Talk with all family members about a fire escape plan and establish a meeting point. Practice the plan twice a year. 4) If a fire occurs in your home, GET OUT, STAY OUT, and CALL FOR HELP. Never go back inside for anything or anyone. See many more emergency resources at www.redcross.org. Click on the "Get Help" tab to get started.

Practice whole home safety, so you and your family are prepared not only during Fire Prevention Month, but throughout the entire year. Having functioning smoke and carbon monoxide detectors installed throughout your home is a vital piece of fire safety month and is your first line of defense. They work around the clock to provide your family with an early alert in the event of an emergency, helping to give you time to safely escape. Smoke and carbon monoxide (CO) alarms should be installed on every level of the home, including the basement, as well as inside and outside each bedroom for whole home detection. Maintain alarms by testing them regularly, changing the batteries every 6 months and replacing alarms at least every 10 years.

Also be prepared with fire extinguishers. Fire extinguishers help stop small fires from causing more damage and should be kept easily accessible on every level of the home, especially in the kitchen and garage. Ensure you know how to operate a fire extinguisher before needing to use one.
