











# Genesis 50:1-6

### I. Jacob's Death (I-6)

"He (Joseph) fell on his father's face..." Fulfillment of God's Promise that "Joseph will close your eyes"?

### I. Jacob's Death (I-6)

Great honor is given to Jacob...
Embalmed (reserved for Kings)
Mourned 70 days (72 days for a Pharaoh)
Mourned by all of Egypt

### I. Jacob's Death (I-6)

Joseph presents his father's request to be buried in Canaan in a way the Egyptians will understand.
Egyptians carefully prepared their own tombs whenever possible.

# **Genesis** 50:7-14

Jacob, the longest-running character in the book of Genesis... involved in chapters 25-50 (half of the book!)

# This journey from Egypt to Canaan foreshadows the future EXODUS!



## Why not take the direct route to the Promised Land? There's a Greater Story

# Genesis 50:15-21

When they SAW their father was dead...

Saw = saw the IMPLICATIONS!

Now would be a good time for

Joseph to get even with us!

The brothers take a CAUTIOUS approach:

- They SENT WORD to Joseph
- They invoke their FATHER'S authority
- Servants of the GOD of your father

Why does Joseph weep?
His brothers have not understood his HEART for reconciliation.

# The CENTRAL message of the entire Book of Genesis:

- You intended harm
- But God intends GOOD
- For the saving of MANY lives

# Genesis points to a GREATER Joseph... And His name is Jesus!

# Genesis 50:22-26

#### IV. The End and The Beginning (22-26)

Joseph... blessed by ANY measure IIO years = Egyptian measure of "blessed" Saw great-grandchildren = Hebrew measure of "blessed"

### IV. The End and The Beginning (22-26)

None of these brothers will live to return to the Promised Land again... yet Joseph is confident that God will SURELY keep His Promise!

"He was placed in a coffin in Egypt"

Coffin = ārôn
"Container, vessel"
Used 6 other times... always to describe
the Ark of the Covenant

As Israel wandered in the desert for 40 years, they carried two ārôns (vessels) with them... one with the bones of A dead patriarch... one with the Covenant of the Living God!

The hope of the one (Joseph) was completely in the PROMISES found in the other!

And the CONTENTS of the other ārôn all point directly to JESUS:

10 Commandments - The WORD of God Manna - The BREAD of LIFE

Aaron's staff - The Resurrected Savior

A beautiful picture is present here:
Joseph's bones are in the one vessel.
But because of His faith in the God
of the Covenant, Joseph's soul is even
now ALIVE in the Eternal Promised Land!
