**Tuesday, June 30th**

**Day 1: The Foundation of Holiness**



**Reading:** Isaiah 6:1-8

**Devotional:** When Isaiah encountered God's throne room, he heard the angels crying "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord Almighty." This threefold declaration emphasizes God's supreme holiness—His absolute perfection and separateness from sin. Like Isaiah, when we truly see God's holiness, we simultaneously see our own sinfulness. This isn't meant to crush us but to prepare us for transformation. Isaiah's response wasn't despair but repentance, leading to cleansing and commissioning. Today, ask yourself: Do I have a proper view of God's holiness? When we understand His perfect standard, we begin to appreciate the magnitude of His grace. Spend time in worship, acknowledging God's holiness and asking Him to reveal areas where you need His transforming touch.

**Wednesday, July 1st**

**Day 2: The Seriousness of Sin**

**Reading:** Romans 3:21-26

**Devotional:** Our culture minimizes sin, treating it as insignificant or even non-existent. But Scripture reveals a different reality: sin is cosmic treason against the holy God. Every violation of God's standard—whether taking His name in vain, harboring bitterness, or pursuing selfish ambition—is an offense against infinite holiness. The seriousness of sin is measured by the One offended. Yet here's the beautiful paradox: the same holiness that makes sin so serious also makes grace so amazing. God doesn't sweep sin under the rug; He dealt with it fully at the cross. Today, examine your heart honestly. Have you minimized sin in your life? Confess specific sins to God, thanking Him that Christ bore the judgment you deserved.

## Thursday, July 2nd

### Day 3: The Cross: Love and Wrath United

**Reading:** Isaiah 53:4-12

**Devotional:** The cross is history's greatest intersection—where God's holy wrath and unfailing love meet. When Jesus hung on Calvary, He wasn't merely a martyr or moral example. He was bearing the full weight of God's righteous judgment against sin. "He was crushed for our iniquities" reveals the intensity of what Christ endured. The wrath we deserved was poured out on Him. This is why the gospel is such good news—not because God ignored our sin, but because He judged it completely in His Son. The darker we understand our sin to be, the brighter Christ's sacrifice shines. Spend time at the cross today. Thank Jesus specifically for bearing your shame, guilt, and the wrath you deserved.

## Friday, July 3rd

### Day 4: Saved from Wrath Through Christ

**Reading:** Romans 5:6-11

**Devotional:** "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." These words should stagger us. We didn't clean ourselves up first; we were enemies when God reconciled us. And notice the promise: "We shall be saved from wrath through Him." This isn't just salvation from past sins but future judgment. Many people trust in religious experiences, church membership, or personal goodness, but these cannot shield anyone from God's wrath. Only Christ can. Have you truly placed your faith in Jesus alone, or are you relying on something else? If you know Christ, rejoice that you're saved not by your merit but by His grace. If you're uncertain, today is the day to trust Him completely.

## Saturday, July 4th

### Day 5: Living in Light of Eternity

**Reading:** Revelation 20:11-15; 21:1-7

**Devotional:** Scripture doesn't shy away from hard truths. The Great White Throne Judgment awaits those who reject Christ—a sobering reality that should move us to both personal urgency and evangelistic compassion. Yet for those in Christ, a different future awaits: no more tears, death, or pain. Understanding God's coming wrath isn't meant to paralyze us with fear but mobilize us with purpose. Who in your life needs to hear about Jesus? That coworker, family member, or neighbor you've been praying for—are you prepared to share the gospel with them? Today, write down specific names and commit to praying for opportunities to share Christ's love. Remember: people will never see Jesus as a big deal until they see sin as a big deal.

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**Closing Reflection:** As you complete this devotional journey, remember that understanding God's holiness and wrath isn't about fear-based religion—it's about seeing the full picture of who God is. His holiness reveals our need; His wrath reveals the seriousness of sin; His love reveals the solution; and His grace reveals His heart. Let these truths transform how you worship, how you live, and how you share the hope you have in Christ.
