Tuesday, June 16th

Day 1: The Supernatural Foundation of Faith



Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

Devotional: Christianity is not a philosophy or social club—it's rooted in the supernatural reality of Christ's resurrection. When we claim to follow Jesus, we're declaring belief in the miraculous: a virgin birth, a sinless life, and a bodily resurrection. Yet how often do we live as though God still performs miracles today? We pray without expecting answers. We solve problems with human wisdom alone. Today, examine your faith honestly. Have you settled for a "watered-down" version of Christianity that's comfortable but powerless? The same God who raised Jesus from the dead is alive and active in your life. Don't just believe the resurrection happened—believe it changes everything about how you live today.

Wednesday, June 17th

Day 2: Life Has Meaning Because He Rose

Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:29-34

Devotional: Paul's message is stark: if Christ hasn't risen, we should just "eat, drink, and be merry, for tomorrow we die." Without resurrection, suffering is meaningless, sacrifice is foolish, and morality is arbitrary. But because Jesus conquered death, everything changes. Your trials have purpose. Your obedience matters eternally. The struggles you face aren't pointless—they're shaping you for eternity. Are you wasting your life being entertained by the very things Christ died for? Sin isn't a harmless diversion. It's what Jesus defeated once and for all on the cross. Wake up from spiritual slumber. Come to your senses. Your life has eternal significance because the tomb is empty.

Thursday, June 18th

Day 3: Your Future Glory Awaits

Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:35-49

Devotional: One day you will have a glorified, resurrected body like Christ's. You won't be a ghost. Not an abstract spirit. But a real, physical, imperishable body that will never age, decay, or die. You'll recognize loved ones in heaven. You'll bear the perfect image of God, free from sin's corruption. This isn't wishful thinking—it's the guaranteed promise of Jesus' resurrection. Just as a seed must die before producing a plant, your physical death is simply preparation for resurrection glory. This truth should transform how you view aging, illness, and even death itself. Your current body is temporary; your future body is eternal. Live today with your eyes fixed on that coming transformation, not the temporary struggles of this fading world.

Friday, June 19th

Day 4: Victory Over Death's Sting

Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:50-57

Devotional: "Death, where is your sting? Hades, where is your victory?" These aren't empty words—they're the battle cry of every believer. Jesus didn't just defeat death for Himself; He defeated it for you. When Christ returns—perhaps today—transformation will happen in the twinkling of an eye. The dead in Christ will rise, and those alive will be caught up together with Him. This isn't distant theology; it's imminent reality. We're closer to Christ's return than any generation before us. The gospel is reaching the nations. Technology makes one-world systems possible. Nothing prophetically must happen before the rapture. Are you ready? Is your faith genuine or cultural? When the trumpet sounds, will you meet Him in the air, or be left behind wondering what happened?

Saturday, June 20th

Day 5: Be Steadfast, Immovable, Abounding

Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:58

Devotional: Paul's conclusion is your marching orders: "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that your labor is not in vain." Because Jesus rose, be steadfast—unshakeable in conviction. Be immovable—unmoved by cultural trends or persecution. Always abound—overflow with kingdom work. Your labor isn't meaningless. Every act of obedience, every sacrifice, every moment of faithfulness matters eternally. Satan doesn't fear Sunday morning gatherings; he fears believers who take resurrection power into Monday through Saturday. Don't settle for empty praise and watered-down faith. Live supernaturally. Pray expectantly. Serve sacrificially. The resurrection isn't just historical fact—it's the power source for radical, world-changing Christian living. Will you be steadfast today?
