## Tuesday, June 23rd Day 1: Stewards of God's Resources



**Reading:** 2 Corinthians 9:6-11

**Devotional:** Everything we possess—our abilities, opportunities, and resources—comes from God's hand. We are not owners but stewards, entrusted with what belongs to Him. This truth should radically reshape how we view our finances, talents, and time. The Corinthian church demonstrated this by generously supporting believers in Jerusalem, not from abundance alone, but from hearts transformed by the gospel. Today, examine your life. Are you hoarding what God has given, or are you a cheerful giver? Remember God's promise: He provides "all sufficiency in all things" for those who sow bountifully. Your generosity isn't just about meeting needs; it's about reflecting the character of the God who gave His only Son for you.

## Wednesday, June 24th Day 2: Submitting Our Plans to God

**Reading:** James 4:13-17; Proverbs 16:1-9

**Devotional:** "If the Lord permits" should be more than a polite phrase—it reveals our understanding of God's sovereignty over our lives. Paul planned extensively, yet he held every plan loosely, recognizing God's authority to redirect his steps. This isn't about avoiding planning; it's about whose agenda drives our planning. When God closed doors to certain regions, Paul didn't force his way through but trusted God's wisdom, which led him to Macedonia and the birth of the Philippian church. What plans are you making for your future? Have you truly submitted them to God's will, or are you arrogantly assuming tomorrow is yours? Make your plans diligently, but hold them humbly, ready to follow wherever God leads.

## Thursday, June 25th

### Day 3: Seizing Gospel Opportunities

**Reading:** Colossians 4:2-6; Acts 16:6-15

**Devotional:** Paul recognized that "a great and effective door has opened to me, and there are many adversaries." Notice he didn't say the door was easy—just open and effective. We often mistake God's will for the path of least resistance, concluding that difficulty means we've missed His direction. But kingdom work frequently involves opposition. The question isn't whether it's comfortable or convenient, but whether God has opened the door. Are you watching for divine appointments in your workplace, neighborhood, or family? Are you praying for eyes to see the opportunities God places before you? Opposition doesn't mean you're in the wrong place; it often confirms you're exactly where God wants you. Be brave. Be strong. Walk through the doors God opens.

## Friday, June 26th

### Day 4: The Urgency of Eternity

**Reading:** Revelation 20:11-15; 2 Corinthians 5:10-21

**Devotional:** When you die, there is no second chance. This isn't meant to create fear but urgency. God's holiness demands that sin be addressed, and His wrath against sin is real and terrifying. Yet in His incredible love, He provided Jesus to bear that wrath for us. The cross demonstrates both God's holy hatred of sin and His merciful love for sinners. This should change how we view everyone around us—our children, coworkers, neighbors. Are they prepared for eternity? The world desperately needs to hear about the Savior who rescues us from coming judgment. Your reputation as a believer should include being someone who cares deeply about where people will spend eternity. Don't let apathy or comfort keep you from sharing the only hope that saves.

## Saturday, June 27th

### Day 5: Living with Maranatha Hearts

**Reading:** 1 Thessalonians 4:13-5:11; Revelation 22:12-21

**Devotional:** "Maranatha"—O Lord, come! Paul ended his letter with this ancient prayer, expressing both longing and readiness for Christ's return. Living with a Maranatha heart means viewing today through the lens of eternity. It means your theology doesn't stay on the pages of Scripture but shapes how you give, plan, serve, and love. It means being generous because you understand you're a steward, not an owner. It means submitting your plans because you trust God's wisdom over your own. It means seizing gospel opportunities because time is short and eternity is long. As you close this devotional, ask yourself: If Jesus returned today, would He find you faithful? Would your life reflect someone eagerly awaiting His return? Live today with eternity in view.
