Congregation: The Lord's Supper is an ordinance of the New Testament, instituted by Jesus Christ; wherein by giving and receiving bread and wine, according to his appointment, his death is shown forth, and the worthy receivers are, not after a corporal and carnal manner, but by faith, made partakers of his body and blood, with all his benefits, to their spiritual nourishment and growth in grace.

May I Come To The Lord's Table?

At San Diego Reformed Church, we
commit ourselves to observe The Lord's
Supper at every Lord's Day service. We are

also acknowledge to the elders of this
congregation that you are in covenant with
God, being active in a congregation which
is covenantally bound to the triune God
through Word and sacrament.





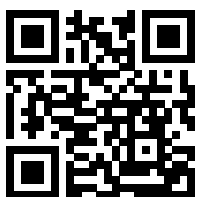
